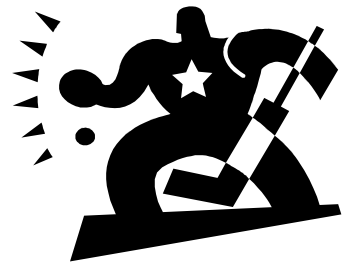

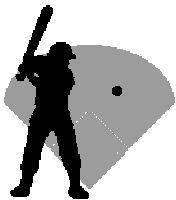

Dear Neighbours

I'm happy to say people are asking me about Emergency Kits. Good to know you are interested in Emergency planning. I have here a basic list for you to start with, remember you should be able to take care of yourself for at least 72 hours.

Basic items you will need to survive for 72 hours:

- Water - at least two litres of water per person per day (including small bottles that can be carried easily in case of an evacuation order)
- Food - that won't spoil, such as canned food, energy bars and dried foods (remember to replace the food and water once a year)
- Manual can opener
- Flashlight and batteries
- Candles and matches or lighter (remember to place candles in sturdy containers and to put them out before going to sleep)
- Battery-powered or wind-up radio (and extra batteries)
- First Aid Kit
- Special items such as prescription medications, infant formula and equipment for people with disabilities
- Extra keys for your car and house
- Some cash in smaller bills, such as \$10 bills (travellers cheques are also useful) and change for pay phones
- A copy of your emergency plan including contact information

## **SAYWARD ABANDONED CATS RESCUE SOCIETY**

Sayward Abandoned Cats Rescue Society is a newly-formed, registered charitable society. Our mission is to trap, neuter/spay, and return homeless cats to the same place from which they were trapped, in an effort to reduce overpopulation and suffering and to improve the quality of life for those cats who are struggling out there to stay alive.

So far, we have had 13 cats neutered or spayed. We need *your* help in executing a feral cat census to increase our eligibility for grant monies with which to carry on this work. We are asking everyone who has read this article and has noted abandoned or feral cats in their area to report these locations to either Elizabeth (250) 282-3240, or Lynne at (250)282-0009. We will be keeping close records of the homeless cats we find/you report. If you are aware of the locations of any feral cat colonies in the village or the valley, please report these, too. All cats being neutered or spayed will be sheltered while recovering from surgery before they are released.

It has come to our attention that there has been some speculation as to what we are trying to achieve as a society. Please contact Elizabeth at (250)282-3240 if you have any concerns with what our society is *about*; also, if you have bottles and/or cans you wish to donate, they can be left at Elizabeth's house, Anne's place, or in Lynne's carport. Our placed collection jars are to help with expenses.

## RCMP REPORT

Sayward Detachment would like to acknowledge the hard work and dedication that Cst. Jesse Foreman has done over the last three years in this community. We wish him and his family all the best at his new posting at Parksville. He will be truly missed. Cst. Mirek Nowak will be his replacement coming to us from Summerland, B.C. Mirek and his wife Susan have two children who will be attending Sayward School in the fall. Welcome Cst. Nowak and family to our beautiful town!

Sayward RCMP have responded to 72 calls for service since the last report. Summary of investigations over the last month:

Investigations of note include:

- Sayward RCMP are pleased to announce that we did not have any riots here locally following the unfortunate loss of the Vancouver Canucks Game 7. We did however have a complaint of a male running through 'Skoganville' with nothing but his Boston Bruins jersey on. Patrols were made however no one found (thank goodness!)
- 
- Five (5) vehicles have been impounded over the last month due to invalid driver's licences or driving while prohibited. Motorists are reminded of the new legislation passed last Fall that gives police greater authorities to impound vehicles.
- 
- Police responded to a male who allegedly pointed a firearm at another person. No further incident occurred. The male was subsequently arrested and brought before a Judge the following morning and released on several firearm related charges.

Sayward R.C.M.P. will be enforcing the Small Vessel Regulations and the Canada Shipping Act over the next few months. Boat operators are reminded to be compliant and have in their possession their Pleasure Craft Operator Card. Also, police will be checking for compliance regarding safety gear on board (ie. lifejackets, bailers, fire extinguishers, flares, etc.) If you are not sure what you must have on board please check out the Transport Canada website or attend the Sayward R.C.M.P. for your free "Safe Boating Guide".
