### Mayors Update July 2011

There was minimal turnout at the Wildfire Protection and Evacuation meeting in the Kelsey Centre on July 18. Sayward is definitely vulnerable, and the presenters put a lot of time and effort into the preparation of this meeting. Another meeting is to be held at the Heritage Hall, and although it will be specifically focussed on protection and procedures to be taken within the Sayward Valley area, there will be some useful information for the entire community. I encourage anyone who was unable to attend the July 18<sup>th</sup> meeting to attend this one when it occurs. Please note that the focus of these meetings is to educate all of us for the protection of our loved ones, pets, homes, property, and friends and neighbours.

Attendance was good at the meeting held on Tuesday 19 Jul to discuss the Sayward Community Primary Health Care Clinic. The objective was to give a small presentation on the history behind the formation of a clinic, advise of some of the pitfalls we have had, and then, most importantly, to form a committee (board) for the formation of the not for profit Sayward Community Health Society. I am pleased to say, five individuals came forward and volunteered, Aggie Pringle, Eve Hrybko Pat Rusch, Lisa Lesigne and Angie Hayward, are the directors, I will be a member of the society. The clinic will be run by the board (directors) without any political or other interference from the village staff, council, regional district or Area A director.

What a fantastic Oscar Daze again this year. Neither rain nor wind stopped the teams from playing. There were many volunteers who helped out at the dance and during the tournament. Thank you, without your help it would not have happened. Bravo Zulu to Michael and Debbie Coates for putting the Oscar Daze tournament together again. I know they spend many hours (days), finding the teams, organizing, doing the draws, ensuring fields are marked, and much more to make Oscar Daze a success. On behalf of the community, thanks Deb and Michael.

I will be attending the Union of British Columbia Municipalities Convention in Vancouver September 25 – 30. Due to budget concerns council has decided that only one person will attend this convention. I have requested meetings be scheduled with Premier Clarke and several ministers to discuss concerns for the Village of Sayward. I will report back to Council with the results of these meetings and also publish them in the Sayward News.

Dear Neighbours

I'd like to thank everyone that helped and those that showed up for our evening at the Kelsey Centre for the WILDFIRE preparedness talk and slide show. We are now going to have another even at the Heritage Hall for our neighbours in the valley on the 29<sup>th</sup> August. At 7 pm everyone is welcome. We are at risk here in Sayward surrounded by forest. Now would be a good time to start planning for the hot weather and how we can enjoy it and not put ourselves at risk. Most fires in the forests in this area have been started by us humans and a few lighting strikes. Keep an eye on the FIRE RISK LEVEL and check for camp fire bans. There is a Fire Smart booklet you can read and take a few tips from. [http://www.pep.bc.ca/hazard\\_preparedness/FireSmart-BC4.pdf](http://www.pep.bc.ca/hazard_preparedness/FireSmart-BC4.pdf) When you read this it might help you decide on the new roof you are planning on, should I pay the extra and go with the metal roof. Which is going to give your home better protection from burning embers blowing in from a forest fire. John Hanson our Fire Chief has built a very simple frame that can be placed over the ridge of your roof with a sprinkler attached. This can be used to wet down your home and lower the chance and even stop the embers that blow in from a forest fire catching hold of your roof and starting a house fire. Come along on the 29<sup>th</sup> and see this sprinkler frame. Learn from John on how you can help save your home by taking steps to reduce your risk.

## **Sayward is getting a Health Clinic!**

**On July 19th, the community met to discuss a future clinic for the community of Sayward. About forty of us were there to hear what the next steps would be. Five of us stepped forward that first night to form the inaugural Sayward Community Health Society. It will be our task in the coming months to get the clinic up and running. Here's where we are in that process:**

**Firstly, we needed to be recognized as a non profit society, with bylaws and a constitution. This has been done through submission to the Provincial Government.**

**Secondly, we needed a building. This has been provided in the form of the former village office building. With a few minor renovations, it will be ready to go with several treatment rooms, a reception area, small kitchen, pharmacy, and group meeting area. In the future we hope to add a trauma room or a 'stabilize and go' room to be used in conjunction with paramedics in cases of severe illness or injury.**

**Now we need to get funding from the Vancouver Island Health Authority to get the clinic appropriately supplied and staffed. We have no reason to believe this will not be forthcoming in a timely fashion. Also, we are persuing additional means of funding such as gaming grants and private donations.**

**In the future, we will need some help getting the building ready and getting supplies in place. There will also be some paid positions once the clinic is up and running, such as reception and clerical staff.**

**What we envision: A fully equipped medical clinic staffed by a full time nurse practitioner. The nurse in question would be able to look after any 'every day' health concerns such as minor injuries or chronic illnesses. For many of us, frequent trips to town will no longer be needed. Imagine not having to go to town for a prescription refill or medication infusion! Or for stitches on that nasty cut you just got working in your shop!**

**Our clinic would also be a venue for visiting practitioners. Some of the disciplines we have been asked to provide:**

**~diabetes education ~prenatal classes ~mammography ~vaccinations ~blood pressure assessment  
~hearing testing ~addictions counseling ~dietician ~family counseling ~physiotherapy ~elder care/  
home care ~'Well Baby' clinic ~massage therapy ~podiatry**

**It is important to stress that this Endeavour is not being taken on by any political body. Although the Village Council and Regional District continue to provide valuable advice and insight, the clinic will be run by and for the community of Sayward, village and valley.**

**We would love to hear from you about what YOU would like to see at YOUR health clinic.**

- 4) ALL KIDS MUST HAVE AN ADULT SUPERVISOR WITH THEM AT THE DOCK
- 5) YOUTH DERBY PRIZES WILL BE DISPLAYED AT THE DOCK AND WILL BE GIVEN OUT AT 1:00 P.M.

- 6) PLEASE SHOW GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP AND USE ONE FISHING ROD FOR EACH PERSON REGISTERED
