Strathcona Regional District (Area 'A')

Sept. 1, 2011

There are no new initiatives to report on that affect the Sayward area. There are considerably fewer meetings in the summer months and there are few new issues that come up.

Planning Service:

In 2010 I had proposed a new funding formula which would stop Area 'A' contributing to the cost of Quadra Is., Cortez Is., and Oyster Bay Community Plan reviews, but it was deferred by the other members of the Electoral Areas Services Committee. A staff report is now being prepared to estimate how much it would cost the other Electoral Areas without having Sayward to subsidize their spending. This report is expected to be ready in September or October. Once this happens I will have another opportunity to convince the others that this is both fair and financially responsible for everyone.

Election:

This year is an election year. I have enjoyed representing all of you at the Strathcona Regional District board table, and would be pleased to continue to do so for the next three year term.

Community Plan Reviews:

Community Plans are an expensive high level plan that indicate the direction that zoning bylaws and land use regulations should take. Much of the Board's monthly business is dealing with applications by builders or others to amend this plan or to allow a variance to one of the community's bylaws. Typically these plans are updated every six or seven years. Sayward has never had one of these plans and does not need one.

Cortez Island is continuing to work on updating their Community Plan which is still in the draft stage after having spent most of their allocated \$80,000.00.

Quadra Island's Community Plan update has received first and second readings and is proceeding to public hearing. They have spend about \$60,000.00 so far.

Oyster Bay has deferred undertaking a review of their Community Plan until another year because the cost is not warranted at this time.

Mayor's Update Aug 2011



August was a light month for council activities. After discussion, and minor amendments, Bylaw 391: Maintenance of Access to Water and Sewer Services was given third reading and adopted. This by-law was put in place for the protection of the residents and businesses and to allow staff access to the water shut off valve. Many current homeowners may not be aware of where the placement of their water shut off valve is, and in some instances they have been covered by home owner landscaping. When a leak occurs, the Village will make its electronic equipment available for locating underground pipes at no charge to the resident. When it is established that the leak is within private property, the property owner must arrange within 3 working days to have the leak repaired at their own expense. Public Works may assist in the location of underground pipes but excavation and repair is the responsibility of the property owner. Should there be any query on interpretation of this by-law, residents are encouraged to contact the village Chief Administrative Officer.

I have had several individuals ask me about the no idling signs that have been installed throughout the village. Provincial mandate states all communities must strive for reduction of Green House Gas emissions, and to become carbon neutral. One of many steps the Village of Sayward has taken to conform to the Provincial mandate was the passing of the No Idling By-law No. 389 on May 04 2011.

On 20 Aug the SFVD held a function honouring our previous Fire Chief Mike Atchison. It was my honour to present Mike with his 25 year, long service medal.

The Mayor's benefit golf tournament for tour de rock was a success. The winners were, Ladies KP Janet Rainbow, Men's KP Charlie Cornfield, first place team was Lorne Simenson, Don Larsen, Ray Faucher and Bob Watson and finally for most birdies Marty Stoner. We raised approximately \$1400.00 for Sayward Tour de Rock. I must thank all of the businesses and individuals who sponsored prizes for the event. A complete list of sponsors is posted on the golf club bulletin board. The Sayward community sponsors were, Linda Fear, Cable Cook House, Cypress Tree Pub, Rainbows End Golf Course, Fisher Buoy RV Park, Morley Wilson, S MacDonald and Dog House Charters.

While talking with Patrick, Father of Daisy (junior Tour de Rock rider), he mentioned how wonderful our community is, and how they pulled together for the fishing derby and golf tournament. Throughout our conversation we both mentioned the time and energy spent by volunteers. Sayward Community Health Clinic Update On August 21st, we had our second meeting to work on getting our new clinic up and running. Enid O'Hara of VIHA joined us and gave us valuable insight into the process of getting the clinic up and running, securing funding, and forming the programs our community wants. Here's our next steps:

1) Get the building ready. We need to do some painting, install some plumbing, and install a door. To this end we are looking for volunteers to assist us in this work at a date to be determined in the near future. We are also looking for donations of paint, painting supplies, sanding and filling equipment, light office supplies[desk lamps etc], a bathroom sink, plumbing supplies, bi-fold or sliding closet-type doors, table and chairs, and wall decor. In the future, we will need to replace the carpet with a more clinic-friendly tile, lamination, or linoleum.

2) Invite practitioners to provide services to our community on a regular basis. This will be at no cost to the clinic as Medical Services Plan and VIHA pays for these practitioners. The patients would incur no costs other than whatever fees the practitioner would normally charge, most of these are covered under MSP or extended medical insurance. We have started approaching people who practice what the community has asked for and we hope to have several of them signed up soon. For instance, we could have a physiotherapist here every Thursday, or a diabetes educator here every other Friday. These services would be provided in addition to vaccination days, flu-shot days, the blood pressure/blood sugar assessment days historically provided by paramedics, etc

3) Apply for funding to hire staff, a nurse practitioner or outpost nurse, and provide more advanced services. We have learned that several different government ministries have grant programs and we now have a list of ministries and committees that we will approach. The first of which is the Strathcona Regional Hospital Society which will be providing us with an annual grant that all rural clinics are eligible for.

4) Build society membership. In early October, we will have a membership drive. This is the community's chance to come forward and get behind us. The date will be announced a few weeks in advance. We have received several enquiries from people willing to volunteer at the clinic once it is running. We would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone that has come forward and we will have lots for you to do. In short, we are moving right along but there is still lots to be done. Please contact us with any questions or concerns you may have. Your clinic board of directors.
