Mayors Update Sep 2011 (Part 1)

This report to the community will be entirely on Union of British Columbia Municipalities Conference.

One of the more volatile topics at UBCM was the installation of Smart Meters by BC Hydro. For the five days of the convention we were met at the entrances by protesters opposing smart meters. The position of Sayward Council is that we are not in favour of Smart Meters. I attended a special panel put on by BC Hydro, where there were many questions in regards to Health issues, costs, job losses and security. At general assembly a vote to put a moratorium on installation of the meters was defeated via electronic vote 55% to 45%. Smart meters will be installed in our homes, municipal bldgs, and commercial bldgs. Sayward is scheduled for installation in spring of 2012. A copy of the booklet given to delegates, "Smart Meter Program", is in the Village Office for all to read. This will answer some of your questions, should you have more, I encourage you to contact BC Hydro at smartmeters@bchydrom.com.

Municipal Auditor General (MAG). There was not a delegate that I personally talked to who was in favour of the appointment of a MAG by the provincial government. Despite municipal objections, Government is carrying forward with this appointment. The MAG will be doing audits on municipalities to ensure that the funds, accounting and reporting procedures are in order. Government states they will not interfere with any municipal policies, and that MAG recommendations will not be binding. By legislation, all municipalities and regional districts already have a yearly audit done. Findings must be reported to the provincial government and presented to the public in an open meeting of council. MAG's audits, done by spot check, will be over and above this process. In their presentations to the conference, both Premier Clark and Minister Chong stated that the MAG would be totally funded by the provincial government. Where do they get their funds but from the taxpayers? I voiced my opinion during debate stating I am not in favour of the MAG position: It does not create any clearer transparency, the public already has access to our audit. Municipalities will not be forced to change policies in accordance with MAG recommendations. They are now, I feel, auditing the auditors and adding an extra expense to the provincial taxpayers. Premier Clark did state there will be more collaboration with UBCM on the MAG; however, it will be established. In all fairness during debate there were a couple of the large municipalities who were in favour of the MAG.

Premier Clark announced two grant programs of interest to Sayward: \$30million for recreation infrastructure, and \$650,000 for Age Friendly BC, which is meant to assist seniors. I have instructed the CAO to check on the criteria for these grants, then upon approval of council, file applications. Ie: for Kelly's Bridge project, refurbishing exterior of Kelsey Centre, trails around the pond, and to implement programs beneficial to seniors.

In the next Sayward News I will give details of my meetings with the Premier, Cabinet Ministers, and special meetings I attended to represent Sayward.

Planning Service:

In my September report I had said that a staff report was being prepared to estimate how much it would cost the other Electoral Areas to pay for their own Community Plan reviews if Area 'A' was not required to subsidize these costs. I am now pleased to report that I was successful in obtaining the support of the other Electoral Area Directors and my motion to have staff prepare a bylaw to effect this change has been unanimously carried both at the Electoral Areas Services Committee and at the Regional Board.

Once this new funding formula bylaw has been prepared by staff it will come back to Electoral Areas Committee for final approval. If it is accepted there it will be forwarded as a recommendation to the entire SRD Board. If it is carried by the Board it will then go to the provincial minister for his final approval. These steps ought to be completed before the 2012 budget is finalized which would result in a tax reduction for all of us in Area 'A'. I am cautiously optimistic.

Election:

I have filed my nomination papers and hope to have your support to continue as your Area 'A' Director for the next three year term.

At 10:20 am on October 20th 2011 , British Columbia will " Drop , Cover , and Hold ON " the great British Columbia Shake Out, the largest earthquake drill in Canadian history. We strongly encourage you to register and participate in this annual drill.
