Mayors Update Jan 2012

As we begin our new year there are many projects which Council hopes to complete in our term. The most important, of course, is to bring our water system up to VIHA standards, and we are presently looking for grants to get this underway. I, along with Council, and all of you, have frustrations with our boil water advisory, they seem to be coming more frequently. Many of you have come forward to complain about how long it takes to remove the boil water advisory. We cannot and will not remove the advisory until we have the clearance from VIHA. VIHA requires us to send a minimum of two samples to their lab for testing, then we must wait for them to give us the all clear to remove the advisory. Once VIHA completes their testing and advises us, we go forward with the one-call system and post notices that the boil water advisory is removed. We do not hesitate or procrastinate at getting the water samples in. Unfortunately, it is a process that we must endure, and we ask for your patience and understanding.

On 14 Jan 2012 Debra Oakman of the Comox Strathcona Regional Hospital District and I, had the honour of cutting the ribbon at the official opening of our Primary Medical Clinic. I was very pleased at the community turnout, and 100% turnout of Council. Director Whalley sent his regrets as he had other electoral duties on Cortez Island. The Society board chair, Aggie Pringle, explained what stage in process the clinic is at now and what future plans they have. This is certainly a work in progress. The ladies on the board (Aggie, Pat, Lisa, Eve, Angie) have done a fantastic job. It will take time. I am confident that with the driving force of the Sayward Community Health Society we will see many health disciplines in our clinic within the next couple of years. I know that the society is looking for input from members of the community, contact them and make your needs and ideas known. You can be a full-fledged member of the society for \$10.00, likely one of the best investments you could make in this community.

Council is looking forward to attending the Newly Elected and Re-elected forum 25 – 27 Jan. This forum is facilitated by the Local Government Leadership Academy. It is here where Council learns basics on being an effective member on Council. A few of the subjects touched are legal, personnel, legislative, community charter, meetings and council procedures. I am confident that all Council members including myself will come back with a wealth of knowledge to assist us in moving forward to the benefit of the Village.

Pesticide Management Plan ID: WFP MIFO #111-219-10-15

Western Forest Products Inc.(WFP), Mid Island Forest Operation under Pest Management Plan WFP MIFO #111-219-10-15 (PMP), is planning to treat up to 240 ha within TFL 39, between April 1st and October 31st, 2012. Treatments will include ground foliar, cut stump and/or basal bark application to Big Leaf Maple, Cottonwood, Red Alder and various ground vegetation using the following herbicides: Vision or Vantage (both Glyphosate), Release or Garlon (both Triclopyr) and Silgard 309 (an additive that maybe used with glyphosate, siloxylated polyether).

A copy of the PMP and maps of the planned 2012 treatment areas are available for viewing until March 30th, 2012 at the WFP Mid Island Forest Operations office between 8:00 am and 4:30pm weekdays, located at 8010 Island Highway, Campbell River, V9W 5E1. Physio Therapist: Klari Varallyai will start providing services in Sayward on February 1st. Her plan is to be here the first Wednesday of every month but she will come up more often if needed. We are starting with physiotherapy because that is what we heard the greatest need for. Our clinic is community driven. If you want a particular service offered, feel free to bring it up to any director. We will keep you posted about new services here in the Sayward News, on our website, and various postings around town.

RCMP REPORT

January 20, 2012

Sayward RCMP have responded to 36 calls for service since the last report. Summary of investigations over the last month: **1 Motor Vehicle Incident, 3 road blocks, 3 complaints of harassing phone calls, 2 thefts, 1 mischief, 1 break and enter to a business, 1 breach of probation, 1 breach of an undertaking, 1 case of uttering threats, 1 breach of the peace and 1 cause disturbance.**

Investigations of note include:

Sayward RCMP assisted by North Island Traffic, Sayward Fire Department and BC Ambulance crews, conducted several roadblocks over the Christmas season which resulted in 12 notice and order "warning tickets", 3 violation tickets, 1 drug seizure and 1 vehicle impound and a lot of education and awareness. Police could not find a single impaired driver and believe me we looked - over 500 drivers were checked, thank you all. Speeding continues to be the menace, though.

Two Port Hardy residents were arrested for causing a disturbance after being thrown off the bus at Sayward Junction. Both were transported to Campbell River where one was lodged for the night at the Queen's Hotel. *Nothing says Christmas like a trip to the Drunk Tank, eh?*

Unknown suspects used a truck or equipment to remove a heavy gate and gained access to a logging camp compound. They left empty-handed after being warned off by barking sausage dogs.

Several reports of nuisance/harassing phone calls were received involving a local couple.

A report of attempted break and enter at a local business. Nothing appeared to have been taken, yet the resulting damage is extensive and expensive to repair.

A report of a single vehicle collision where the driver of a Ford F350 4x4 lost control, went off the road and into the ditch. The Ford might have been infallible, but the driver was not and was later charged with a breach of recognizance in an unrelated matter. He might also be charged with higher insurance.

Some martin and crab traps were removed from their rightful owners, who would like them and the contents returned undamaged.

Sayward RCMP would like to remind drivers to adjust their driving to the road conditions and insurance coverage.
