#### Message from Mayor John MacDonald:

On behalf of Council, I am pleased to present the 2011 Annual Report for the Village of Sayward for the reporting period January 1, 2011 to December 31, 2011. The Annual Report includes the 2011 audited financial statements and highlights of major initiatives and accomplishments.

Our CAO/CFO resigned in October 2011. Council sought an interim CAO/CFO with the position being filled by Mr. Bill Halstead until a new permanent CAO/CFO was hired.

Through the commitment of Council and staff the Village continues to strive to meet and exceed the expectations of the Village of Sayward's residents in the delivery of public services.

2011 was an election year, the new Council consists of Mayor John MacDonald, who was acclaimed and elected Councillors Al Braybrook, Norm Kirschner, Michael Marsh and Diane Mason.

Outgoing Councillors Debbie Coates and Rosemary Croteau are to be thanked for their dedication to the Village of Sayward and for the years of service they put in on Council (Debbie Coates - 6 years and Rosemary Croteau - 3 years).

February 2011 saw the Village offices move to the basement of Kelsey Recreation Centre. The Village was fortunate to receive approval to use surplus funds from the HVAC grant to install three way zone valves which made it possible to properly control the heat in the basement of the Kelsey Centre. The move to the Kelsey Centre allowed for new larger Council chambers that can accommodate 57 people, double the capacity of the previous chambers. As part of the office relocation the Red Cross medical equipment lending service moved out of the Kelsey Centre into the #2 Fire Hall. In addition, the Public Works foreman's office was moved to the Public Works Yard which helped to improve efficiencies as he is now closer to the operations. Computer hookups for internet and the SKADA system were installed along with the new telephone lines. An integral part of this move was allowing the former municipal office building to be used for a medical clinic for the community. A town hall meeting was held to form a board for the medical clinic. Five members of the community volunteered and formed the not-forprofit Sayward Community Health Society (SCHS). The official opening of the Sayward Health Clinic was June 14, 2011. The clinic is a work in progress. The SCHS Board is looking for medical personnel and other professionals who will commit and contract to fill the various health disciplines and services needed by the community.

The Friends of Kelsey Centre was formed as a not-for-profit society in March 2011. Their mandate is to assist the Kelsey Recreation Centre with the acquisition of equipment and assistance with the payment of various recreation programs. The Friends of Kelsey Centre applied for and received a grant for the installation of a handicap ramp leading to the Village offices, the funding has been turned over to the Village and the project will be completed in 2012.

The Village was not successful in receiving a Towns for Tomorrow grant to upgrade our water system. Council and staff will continue to work with the Vancouver Island Health Authority (VIHA) to upgrade the Village's water system to meet the required standards. Grant applications will be submitted in 2012 so that the Village can move forward with this project. In the meantime the water system continues to be monitored and tested on a daily basis.

Western Forest Products (WFP) moved part of their operations back to the Kelsey Bay Log Sort which was excellent news for the local economy. The Village has fostered a great working relationship with WFP that has helped to ensure the needs of both the area residents and the company are met. One such area of cooperation that has come about through these meetings was a request from the Village to WFP to not log part of the watershed that supplies the Village with drinking water until a new water treatment plant was in place. This area of forest was part of their scheduled block for logging in 2011 but through a co-operative agreement made between Council and WFP they postponed the logging of the watershed area. Several meetings were held advising WFP of the Village's progress with the water system.

The primary aeration cell in the sewage lagoon was replaced using surplus funds from the Storm and Sanitary Systems grant. Councillor Kirschner's Green Initiatives Committee also planted cedar trees along the fence of the sewage lagoon which has helped with the esthetics of the lagoon area.

Council wishes to recognize and thank the many volunteers who sit on Village committees, assist with programs initiated by the Village and in countless other ways that have made our community a better place to live.

Infrastructure improvements, service delivery and the livability in our community were high priorities with Council in 2011and will remain so as we move through 2012 and beyond.
