As Mayor, I have a duty to Council, staff and the Village of Sayward (VOS). My duty to the VOS is always to do my best to represent the VOS, and work for the good of VOS through my dealings with the federal and provincial governments, other organizations, committees and staff.

I am not to be considered as the ultimate authority at Council meetings. My role is to lead (not dictate) and to be part of the decision-making process, where I will draw upon my experience and knowledge. It is often said that the mayor is the decision maker however that is not the case. I am one of five votes, and it is a majority vote that makes all council decisions.

On occasion I am advised about rant and rave posts on Facebook, that are frequently not researched by the individual making the comment. A classic example is the Tax Rate By-law, and the increase in taxes to Village homeowners. The VOS municipal tax increases this year (2019) are approximately \$80.00 for the average home. This includes water, sewer and solid waste. All other increases are those which are **not controlled by the Village of Sayward**, which means we collect the taxes for those agencies and must pay them according to the requisition sent to the VOS.

There is still much talk about the Kelsey Centre operations. First of all, let me say for my part I have not heard of any community with a Recreation Centre that makes money or actually breaks even. In consultation with the CAO and staff, Council has decided to close the Kelsey Centre for an extra month this year to save costs. We are looking at ways to increase the revenue stream for the Kelsey Centre and have come up with some increased rental and usage costs as per our new Fees and Charges By-law Number 451, 2019. The Kelsey Centre is an important pillar of the community for use by everyone. We (Council) are open to any constructive written comments (positive or negative) about KC programs, ways to increase the revenue stream, and hours of operation.

Recently Council held a Committee of the Whole meeting for discussion about economic development for the Sayward community. At the end of our meeting we invited Sayward Futures Society and the Tourism Committee to participate, where our ideas were shared. It is the intention of Council to involve both Sayward Futures Society and the Tourism Committee as we move forward with economic development & tourism initiatives for the community. These two groups will be taking the lead on some of the initiatives and will then present their plans to Council for council support.

#### **Kelsey Centre Survey Results:**

In the previous newsletter I asked for your advice as to whether you are supportive or opposed to me entering into talks with the Village about the Strathcona Regional District taking over ownership of the Village Recreation Centre in order to share the cost of running this facility. I'd like to begin by personally thanking everyone who contacted me in response. This is how a democracy is supposed to work! The result of your responses is that 93% of the respondents are opposed. Therefore, I will entertain no further discussion with the Village about pursuing this issue and I now hope that we can consider this entire matter to be closed.

#### **Valley Financial Support:**

I have come to realize that some Valley residents are unaware of what activities we actually do contribute money towards. First of all let me clarify that we do not have a Recreation Service and do not contribute anything whatsoever to the Strathcona Gardens complex or any other Campbell River facility. The Village of Sayward exclusively operates the Fire Suppression services and the Valley contracts firefighting coverage from the Village, paying 60% of the cost. We pay 65% of the costs to produce and distribute the Sayward News. We also annually have paid approx. 83% of the total costs of the three weekend clean-ups at the Highway Yard. We own both the Valley Fire Hall and the Heritage Hall and pay 100% of all of their net costs. We also contribute money to the RCMP Bicycle Rodeo and the Village Health Clinic. In addition we pay our share of all those other government services outlined on your Property Tax notice, such as: Local Gov't Administration, Electoral Area Planning, Hospital, Solid Waste, 911 Service, etc.

#### Transparency:

The provincial government has recently enacted legislation that requires that all emails to or from an elected representative of local government that speak to any Regional District business must be available for any potential Freedom of Information requests. To comply with this requirement the Strathcona Regional District (SRD) has issued each Electoral Area Director with a new local government email address. Mine is noted at the bottom of this newsletter. Please be aware that from now on any email or written correspondence will pass through the Regional District Server and be permanently stored there. If you wish that your comments not be recorded, then a phone call or a personal visit are the best options.
