## Garden Club News

Happy Autumn! The Garden Club's September meeting began with an informal round robin checking in on what is happening in each other's gardens. The monthly round robin gives us a chance to ask garden-related questions, discuss solutions to problems, and celebrate the successes of the season. Long-time gardeners welcome the opportunity to share their experience and encourage new gardeners, but we all come away having learned something new from each meeting. Our September discussion ranged from curing and storing potatoes,

dealing with slugs and powdery mildew, and best timing for weed control. The round robin was followed by a "show and tell" featuring our favourite, sometimes surprising, tools, including an innovative hoe loop, a manual backhoe, a forest fire shovel, and a Japanese division knife.

If you missed this informative meeting, you won't want to miss the October 10<sup>th</sup> gathering featuring guest speaker Master Organic Gardener Connie Kuramoto of *Gardens to Go*. Check out Connie's blog <a href="http://lazygardenliving.com">http://lazygardenliving.com</a> where she introduces her lifelong love affair with plants, "I fell in love with plants one morning . . . and just never fell out of love." Connie's talk in October "Boil and Bubble—Garden Teas and Brews" is sure to inform on ways to boost beneficial microbes in our gardens.

With the turn of summer to fall and the days shortening, Sayward gardeners have begun their fall cleanup. This can be a big chore at a time when we are busy collecting seeds and preserving the fruits of our summer labour. We can lessen autumn chores, though, while nurturing biodiversity in our gardens. It is important to remove vegetation from tomatoes, peppers, peonies, iris, and roses and to rake up rotting fruit to avoid future fungal and disease problems, but it is not necessary at this time of year to cut all annuals and perennials to the ground. Do deadhead the herbs and flowers you don't want to seed all over the garden next year and pluck out pernicious weeds, as they are easier to identify now and easier to pull out after a fall rain or two. But let seeds from asters, borage, coneflowers, coreopsis, cosmos, sunflowers, and the like ripen in place to feed small birds during the food-sparse months of the year. Chickadees, wrens, and towhees will also consume a multitude of protein-rich insects from dried plant stems throughout the winter and early spring and will thank you for your garden's planned untidiness.

The Garden Club welcomes all, so please join us! There is no annual membership fee and the drop-in fee is just one looney per meeting. Meetings are held at 7:00 p.m. on the second Thursday of the month.


We are delighted to have the All Stars perform in Sayward and hope every one will come out to enjoy the show.


