Finger Dock Closure

Sayward Futures Society is obligated to have a wharf inspection every five years. The inspection was done over this Spring and we recently received the completed report, which determined that the lower finger dock and the breakwater pilings are in very poor condition and deemed a public safety hazard.

In consultation with the engineer Ralph Watts, from North Island Engineering, and Joe McAlister, from Tuff Marine Repairs,

THE FINGER DOCK IS TEMPORARILY CLOSED TO PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC AND BOAT MOORAGE UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

SFS is awaiting cost estimates on three options:

- 1. Complete removal of the dock and breakwater;
- 2. Repair of the existing dock and breakwater; or
- 3. Replacing the dock and repairing the breakwater.

Once we receive the estimates, we will make a decision on proceeding.

In the meantime, in order to maintain public safety, we cannot provide moorage or pedestrian access to the finger dock. Moorage may be available at the nearby Small Craft Harbour.

Garden Club News

Fall Potluck Coming Up

Extreme weather events are hard on gardeners, first no rain and then nothing but. For those of us who grow pole beans for the beans inside, we are still hoping for some sunny weather before the frost comes. And finding the last of the hidden cucumbers and squashes is a happy surprise.

This is the time to plant fall cover crops like fall rye or other cover crop combinations that include peas. You need to plant deep using a rototiller or cover the planting with remay cloth to avoid losing your seed to those cheeky Stellar's Jays.

This is the time to plant bulbs including garlic. Great garlic is grown here using good compost and some bone meal, same for the flower bulbs.

The Garden Club sponsored a Fall Harvest Fair at the Heritage Hall on September 15. There were over a hundred entries in nineteen different categories of vegetables and flowers. It was great to see families with young kids coming to see what can be grown here. Should we continue this event next year?

The next meeting of the Garden Club will be our fall harvest potluck. Many of the dishes the members bring are made with our local vegetables, fish and game. The dinner begins at 5:30 on Thursday, October 11. Following the potluck we will have our usual question and answer session with special emphasis on the subject of tree fruit pruning. Please come and join us.







Sayward nearly loses School Board Trustee Position

September 17, 2018, Sayward- Resident of Sayward, Gail Kirschner, has served as the Sayward Trustee on the Board of Education for School District 72 for the past 4 years but is not seeking re-election this year, and as of 24 hours before the nomination deadline, neither was anyone else. As with other small communities the number of

people in Sayward available to hold these positions is limited. With nobody available to fill the position, parents and staff at the Sayward School were feeling nervous. "Parents had approached several people, but nobody was able to take it on this term and we were running out of options. We were scared that if the position wasn't filled there was a possibility that not only would Sayward not have a voice for the four year term, but that the position may not be open for nomination again in the future, leaving us without someone to represent our area and our kids" said Melissa Coates, a Sayward parent.



A last-minute suggestion amongst the parents was a resident who had recently moved back to the community with her family, which included a soon-to-be school age daughter, and would be a good fit for the position, if she was willing to do it. "We approached her the day before the deadline and initially she wasn't sure but after reading up on the duties and requirements and the importance of our community having a Trustee, she agreed to be nominated for the position" said Coates.

Shannon Briggs, 33, is now the single candidate running for the position in her area. "Some parents that I've known since I was a kid came flying out of the school when they realized I was at the playground with my daughter and they were so excited to ask me to run. Their excitement was contagious and after learning about the position I walked to the Village Office next door to pick up a nomination package and sent it in that night!" Briggs, who lived in Sayward until she was 18, completed her Social Work Degree at the University of Victoria and worked as a Diversity Projects Coordinator at the Immigrant Welcome Centre of North Vancouver Island for 6 years. "I love being be back in my hometown and am honoured that they thought of me. I'm eager to learn the ins-and-outs from the long-term board members and to continue to foster my passion for education and diversity awareness while representing my community" said Briggs. Voting will take place on Saturday, October 20, 2018.

Elector Registration (voting day only registration)

There is no need to pre-register to vote as the registration of all electors for this election will take place at the time of voting. You will be required to make a solemn declaration that you meet the following requirements:

- be 18 years of age or older on voting day
- be a Canadian citizen
- be a resident of BC for at least 6 months immediately preceding voting day (since April 19, 2018)
- be a resident of OR registered owner of real property in the Village of Sayward for at least 30 days immediately preceding registration (since September 19, 2018), and
- not be disqualified by any enactment from voting in an election or otherwise disqualified by law.

Resident electors will also be required to produce 2 pieces of identification confirming your identity and place of residence (at least one with a signature) or 2 pieces of identification confirming your identity one of which must contain your signature and you will be required to make a solemn declaration as to your place of residence. Picture identification is not necessary.

Acceptable identification includes BC Drivers License, BC Identification Card, Social Insurance Card, Debit Card, Credit Card, Vehicle Insurance, Birth Certificate, Citizenship Card, tax notice, or utility bill such as hydro, telephone, cable, showing residential address. Please note that the combined Drivers License & Care Card are one piece of identification.

Non-Resident Property Electors will be required to fill out an application for registration by providing proof of ownership of the property (title certificate or current title search); 2 pieces of identification confirming your identity (one of which must contain your signature), and a non-resident property elector consent form of a majority of the registered owners, if there is more than one owner. If there is more than one registered owner of the property, only one of those individuals may, with the written consent of the majority of the owners, register as a non-resident property elector. FUTURES Sayward Futures Society Report:



Mayors Update September 2018

Since my last update there has been a few things happening that will be of interest to the community. First, our CAO and I attended UBCM in Whistler, where we met with three Ministers and various ministerial staff. Before I expand on our Minister meetings, we had asked for a meeting with Premier Horgan, but were denied due to his schedule.

Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure (Trevena): Once again the Minister was questioned about the Menzies Mountain (Highway 19) passing lane that was promised for 2018. The Minister, who is also our MLA, assured us that the project will occur in 2019. The lack of cell coverage on Highway 19 was also discussed, along with the status of our Water Treatment Plant, Dam Decommissioning and Working Waterfront projects. The financial status of each project was also mentioned. Our relationship with local First Nations was discussed as well. While each meeting was to last only 15 minutes, we were able to meet with Minister Trevena for 25 minutes, which was very positive development.

Minister of Citizens Services (Sims): The main purpose of our meeting with Minister Sims was to discuss the importance of cell service on Highway 19. We expressed concerns that by not having cell coverage, public safety is being put at risk, not to mention the impact on tourism and economic development. The Minister was advised that we have written the CRTC and Telus on this matter, but the answers we received were certainly less than positive. We were advised to prepare a comprehensive business plan for the Ministry, and to include input from the communities of Gold River, Tahsis, Zeballos and Sayward. I will be bringing this forward to the Strathcona Regional District Municipal Services Committee following the upcoming elections. Minister Sims also mentioned that her staff would be available to assist as required.

Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing (Robinson): Minister Robinson, who is the Minister responsible for municipalities, was also provided an update on our Water Treatment Plant, Dam Decommissioning and Working Waterfront projects. As with the previous meetings, this one was also positive. The Minister was advised that the Water Treatment Plant, which came in well over budget, has had a significant impact on our overall financial picture and put us in a difficult position where we will have to reconsider the timing of important future projects. The Minister and her team advised that two new grants were just announced that will benefit communities with populations under 5,000. Our CAO will be having a look at these grants to determine how our community can benefit from them.

On a positive note for UBCM, the procedure for handling resolutions was greatly improved. However, if I had to say anything negative about the UBCM Convention, they must find a way to hold the Minister meetings in the evening, or at other times that do not conflict with the resolution sessions.

The networking with other provincial and local government politicians and officials is still one of the most important parts of this convention. Equally important of course are the forums and hearing how others handle sometimes intolerable situations. One always learns from others positive and negative experiences.

Before I go on, I would like to impress on every citizen in the Village the importance of voting for your Council. We have five candidates this time vying for four spots on Council. Make your voice known with an informed decision and come out to the all candidates' session.

Village Projects:

Working Waterfront Trail - Some design and cost issues. Phase one trail completion fall of 2018.

Mall Store - No response from owner about the cancelation of their Tax Exemption Certificate.

Water Treatment Plant - Contract issued, work in progress. Completion spring of 2019.

Dam Decommissioning - Ongoing, expected completion fall of 2019.

<u>Park Pond</u> - Looking at other ways to control the algae. Applying for grant to have a consult done.

Roads, Grounds and Gardens - Ongoing, regular maintenance checks of all culverts, etc.

<u>Recreation</u> – Kelsey Centre open again with programs for everyone.

Finance – Managers to begin work on the 2019 Budget for presentation to Council later this fall.
