







### **Emergency Phone Notification Systems**

Our phone notification service requires your assistance. We need new residents to provide us with your phone number and street address so we can add you to our phone notification system. If you move within the community, please let us know so we can send our notices to the correct people.

This system is used by the Village's Public Works staff to let Village residents know of problems with the water, sewer or other systems. It can be used to notify the entire community of any emergency situations. It is important that we keep our resident list current. The system only allows for 10 digit phone numbers, no long distance can be used.

If you have not been receiving calls that you know have been sent out, please let us know.

The Sayward Community Health Society would like to remind patients registered at the Clinic, that we have two holter monitors available for use locally. We usually have a short wait time. Using the Clinic monitors allows you to avoid taking two trips to Campbell River in a 24-hour period. We also have Telehealth, which allows for follow-up consultations with out-of-town specialists through the system, saving you the time and expense of travelling to Nanaimo, Victoria, or even the Mainland. It's worth asking about your appointment with an out-of-town specialist at the Clinic before planning a medical trip.



Our Nurse Practitioner Tracey Payne carries out drivers' physicals at the bargain price of \$65 for Associate Members and \$75 for non members. This not only saves a trip to town, but is much cheaper than elsewhere. The biggest bonus of using this local service is that the Society receives all monies paid for drivers' physicals, so every penny goes towards the running costs of the Clinic and helps us keep the doors open.

As a Community Clinic, we are not fully funded by any Authority or level of Government, so we are free to spend the money we receive on equipment that most benefits the Sayward community. The Society has concentrated recently on acquiring equipment that helps save patients unnecessary trips to town and on providing the services, such as lab days, that are most needed here. As a Community Clinic, though, we are dependent on the goodwill and help of the local community. For just \$10.00 a year, you can become an Associate Member and greatly support keeping the Clinic doors open. Memberships can be issued at the Clinic. At this time, we would in particular like to thank the following for their valued and continuous

### **SAYWARD GARDEN CLUB**

The Sayward Garden Club's November meeting saw a lively sharing of ideas for winter gardening. Anticipating this discussion, Alex Turner brought in a West Coast Seeds' Fall and Winter Planting Guide, which is free online. While this guide is useful for choosing winter hardy varieties and provides a rough guide for fall and winter garden planting dates, we do need to keep our more northerly island climate in mind and plant a little earlier for fall and winter than West Coast Seeds indicates. This observation led to an exciting new project that Sheila Archer has volunteered to undertake. Having recently moved to Sayward from Saskatchewan, Sheila is keen to learn best planting dates for our area. Drawing on her background in genetic research, Sheila intends to map out our growing terrain and determine frost dates for

the different microclimates throughout the village and valley. This will eventually be shared with all.

Another ongoing, if less organized, project by garden club members is saving seed from year to year to develop seed acclimated to our growing conditions. On our monthly meeting Opportunity Table, you might find, for example, some three -year-old spring onion seed or, if lucky, some eight-year old early tomato seed, some highly prized heritage drying beans, or some newly-split hardy perennial plants. For a small donation, which helps pay for an annual speaker, you can pick up any of the table's special offers.

Jeannie Martin discussed her success over several years with winter sowing seeds in milk jug "greenhouses." Even if you have a grow light setup and/or a greenhouse, you might find you prefer to start seeds following this simple outdoor sowing method. A good set of instructions can be found at Winter-Sowing 101 by Kevin Lee Jacobs

https://www.agardenforthehouse.com/2012/11/winter-sowing-101-6/ The best part of this method is that there is no need to harden off new plants before setting them out. Hardy plants like kale, broccoli, arugula, leeks, and spinach can be started in January, while tender plants like impatiens, cosmos, beets, basil, parsley, and marigolds can be milk-jug sown in March.

In addition to winter gardening, November saw us discussing how to repot Christmas cactuses and how to control buttercup, a pernicious weed in our damp acidic soil.

Our next meeting on December 12th will begin at 5:30. This will be our annual Christmas potluck at which we hope to see new faces as we are always hoping new gardeners will join our small but enthusiastic and informative group. In January, we will be starting meetings at a new time, 6:30 rather than 7:00 p.m., hoping this earlier time will make coming out in the evening a little more accommodating.







Over the summer there have been no significance issues at the SRD Board table that affect the Sayward Valley. Much of the Board's time was spent on the censure of Electoral Area B (Cortes Island) Director Noba Anderson for releasing confidential in-camera information in violation of the Community Charter, SRD Bylaw No. 330, and the Directors Oath of Office.

Currently we have begun budget deliberations for 2020. I do not see a need for any tax increases for those services that I have control over, such as the Heritage Hall Service. For the other services that I do not have any control over, for example: Solid Waste, Hospital, Electoral Area Planning, and General Administration; I will continue to fight to maintain reasonable costs. I am proud of our low tax rate and I intend to keep it that way.

#### **Solid Waste Board:**

This service is run jointly with the Comox Valley Regional District and is the most frustrating Board that I sit on. They are determined to continue to dig pits and bury our garbage which has been seeping toxins into our soil and polluting our air and water tables. Several years ago garbage disposal was entirely paid for by tipping fees without any tax requisition. Now it costs us \$6Million in property taxes plus steadily increasing tipping fees. This is the main reason why the annual bill that we each are mailed for curbside garbage collection goes up and up every year. The main problem is that staff and most Directors refuse to seriously consider modern technology that could drastically reduce these costs. For example, I had proposed that we look at a firm called UBQ Materials Ltd. This company uses advanced technology to convert unsorted household waste into a recyclable plastic substitute. The process is energy efficient, uses no water and produces zero effluents or fumes. It accepts everything from banana peels to dirty diapers to used yogurt containers, paper, mixed plastics and cardboard. Every ton of UBQ Material produced diverts the equivalent of 12 tons of CO2, and is the most climate-positive thermoplastic material on the planet. But simply asking staff to give the Board a report on this process was met with complaints from staff that they are overworked, and opposition from other Board members. After I strongly argued for this report at the Solid Waste Board last week, this motion narrowly passed the final vote. I will continue to do whatever I can to get our solid waste costs back on track. (If you are interested, Google 'UBQ'.)

### Feeding a School

November 20, 2019, Sayward- A \$12,000 grant from Island Health has been received by the Sayward Parents Advisory Committee (PAC) and the Sayward Children's Health Hub. The funds will support students to create a school cookbook and to purchase nutritious food for the free weekly school lunch program and the Hub drop in program.

The cookbook project, in partnership with Sayward Literacy Now, will allow each child to design a cover and submit their favourite healthy recipes. Once complete, families and community members can purchase the cookbooks, each with a unique cover designed by a different student. Each week, one student's recipe will be chosen for the lunch program and served to the 45 children that make up the entire student population. Profits raised from the sale of the cookbooks will cover much needed kitchen supplies for the PAC to continue the popular lunch program.

The project provides the opportunity for families to see what other families are eating at home, validate student's healthy food choices and starts positive discussions. The volunteer PAC coordinated free lunch program normally operates solely through fundraising, food discounts and donations and is heavily supplemented with volunteers own personal funds. The grant will provide an estimated 2200+ meals to students.
