

2018 Watering Restrictions Now in Effect

The Village of Sayward is implementing watering restrictions. Authority to restrict water usage is set out in Water Regulation Bylaw No. 391.

The following water restrictions are effective from May 23, 2018 to September 30, 2018;

Watering is only permitted between the following hours:

6 AM to 10AM; and 6 PM to 10 PM

Even Numbered Homes, Apartment and Condo Buildings, Mobile Homes, etc.

Residences with address numbers ending in an even number (e.g. 110 Dyer Dr.), watering is allowed on even days of the month (Aug 24, 26, 28, 30, etc.).

Odd Numbered Homes, Apartment and Condo Buildings, Mobile Homes, etc.

Residences with address numbers ending in an odd number (e.g. 111 Dyer Dr.), watering is allowed on odd days of the month (Aug 23, 25, 27, 29 etc.).

These restrictions are intended to ensure that ALL residents receive an adequate supply of water throughout the summer months and that sufficient reserve supplies are available should they be required for emergency fire fighting purposes.

PLEASE NOTE: Parking lot, driveway, and car washing is only permitted between 6 AM to 10 AM and 6 PM to 10 PM on your designated watering days.

SAYWARD COMMUNITY BURSARY

INFORMATION, REQUIREMENTS & APPLICATION

The purpose of the Sayward Community Bursary is to reward deserving, well-rounded students and to assist them in their post secondary education.

Applicants:

- Must have resided at least one year in Sayward
- Must have a parent residing in Sayward at the time of the application
- Must show proof of acceptance in a post secondary program
- May apply annually for five years following secondary school completion

Applications should include:

- A letter of introduction written by the applicant, including some personal history
- A list of community activities and/or volunteer services, along with letters or reference
- A transcript of marks for grades 11 and 12
- An indication of future education plans
- Any other pertinent information

Please submit applications to the Sayward Community Bursary Committee by **August 17th** of the school year in which you will be taking post secondary courses.

Please note: Students are encouraged to update their applications by August 17th each following year, with transcripts of marks, indication of future education plans and any other pertinent information, in order to qualify for further monies should they become available.

Sayward Community Bursary Committee

The Sayward Bursary Committee shall be composed of one representative from each of the contributing organizations or households. A representative from a contributing youth organization must be an adult. A person with a direct relationship with an applicant may not sit as a representative on the Committee. Contributors are requested to deposit their donations with the Sayward Bursary Committee by September 1st in order to facilitate planning.

Bursary Criteria

The committee will select bursary recipients as soon as possible after school starts in the fall. Alternates may also be chosen, in case an original recipient does not begin his/her post secondary courses as planned. The committee will issue the Bursary monies in two instalments of equal amounts.

The first cheque will be issued to the student as soon as possible after October 15th, once either a letter of acceptance or proof of registration is received.

The second cheque will be issued as soon as possible after February 15th, with confirmation to the Committee that the student is still attending school.

If the student does not begin the second term of post secondary education, the second cheque will be withheld and awarded to an alternate.

In the event that the bursary is not awarded to a student beginning his/her post secondary education, the Committee will meet to select recipients from previous applicants who have submitted updated letters of application.

The Sayward Primary Healthcare Clinic is happy to announce that we will be providing a free Chronic Pain Self Management Program, starting in September. This is a 6 session workshop for adults with any kind of ongoing pain. Family and friends are welcome. A friendly reminder that with the hotter temperatures, you will need to ensure you stay adequately hydrated. If you notice your urine is getting darker yellow in colour, drink more water. Stay indoors or in the shade during the hottest part of the day. Wear sunscreen and a hat!



Garden Club News

August is the month of rewards for gardeners with annual flowers in bloom and vegetables maturing in the sun. Broccoli have produced the main head and after that is cut will produce endless side shoots into the fall if they are not allowed to turn to yellow flowers. The peas are finishing up and the bush beans are just starting to bear. Zucchini's are ready to pick and early potatoes are waiting to be dug up. What a bounty!

This has been a great year for raspberries and currants, requiring regular picking and a chance for friends and neighbors to join in. There follows the fun of making jam and wine and filling up the freezer.

This is also the time of the year of year to watch for mature weeds. Sneaking in between the flowers and vegetables, they will soon start spreading seeds to make little weeds for years to come. Going on a dedicated "weed patrol" will spot these hidden menaces. They can be pulled up or cut off if pulling threatens the desired plants. If your compost is hot enough to cook these seeds, it is safe to include these mature weeds. To get a hot compost you need to water the pile to keep it damp. The compost also needs enough nitrogen content with greens like lawn clippings, animal manure or blood meal and it needs to be turned every two weeks.

The Garden Club is planning a Fall Fair for September that will be a non-competitive opportunity for gardeners to show off their flowers, vegetables, canning, animals etc. Watch in the September article for a list of categories. This event is for all growers in the community, not just club members. Happy gardening.

Finger Dock Closure

Sayward Futures Society is obligated to have a wharf inspection every five years. The inspection was done over this Spring and we recently received the completed report, which determined that the lower finger dock and the breakwater pilings are in very poor condition and deemed a public safety hazard.

In consultation with the engineer Ralph Watts, from North Island Engineering, and Joe McAlister, from Tuff Marine Repairs,

THE FINGER DOCK IS TEMPORARILY CLOSED TO PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC AND BOAT MOORAGE UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

SFS is awaiting cost estimates on three options:

1. Complete removal of the dock and breakwater;
2. Repair of the existing dock and breakwater; or
3. Replacing the dock and repairing the breakwater.

Once we receive the estimates, we will make a decision on proceeding.

In the meantime, in order to maintain public safety, we cannot provide moorage or pedestrian access to the finger dock. Moorage may be available at the nearby [Small Craft Harbour](#).

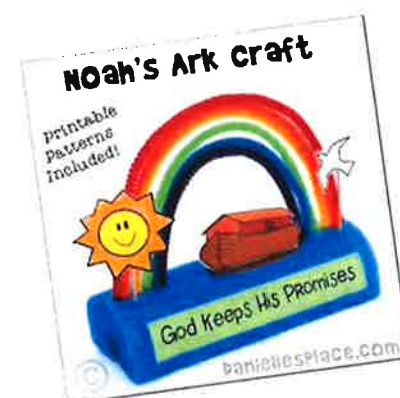

- not be eligible to register as a resident elector in the Village
- only register in relation to one piece of property - if more than one person owns the property, only one owner may register and that person must have the written consent of the majority of the other owners. A majority of the owners must complete and sign a Non-Resident Property Elector Consent Form. Forms will be available from the Village office prior to the election;
- not be disqualified by any enactment from voting or be otherwise disqualified by law.

While it is possible for Non-Resident Property Electors to register to vote on Voting Day they are encouraged to complete the application prior to October 19th, 2018.

NOTE: In accordance with the Local Government Act, the only persons who are registered owners, either as joint tenants or tenants-in-common, are individuals who are not holding the property in trust for a corporation or another trust.

Voting by Mail

Voting by Mail will also be available for 2018. Resident and Non-Resident Electors have the option of mailing their ballots. Council made this change to the Village Election Bylaw in response to comments received from the community. The Voting by Mail option is available to any qualified voter who will be unable to attend the Advance Vote or the General Vote due to physical disability, illness, or absence from the Village.

Voters must provide registration information to confirm they are qualified to vote. Ballots will be in an envelope separate from the registration and will only be opened if the registration confirms the eligibility of the voter. The Voting by Mail package must be returned by the close of voting on October 20th. Voters expecting to be unable to vote at either the Advance Vote on October 10th or General Voting on October 20th will be able to apply for a Voting by Mail package. Voting by Mail packages will be available in early October, as soon as ballots are printed. Additional information will be available in the Notice of Election. If you expect to be using the Voting by Mail option please contact the Village Office as soon as possible.

2018 CHANGES:

Election Date

Provincial Legislation has moved the election and consequently the nomination period earlier by one month, resulting in the dates listed above.

Campaign Financing

Elections BC has established limits for campaign expenditures that vary according to the size of the community. For Sayward the candidate expense limits are \$10,000 for Mayor and \$5,000 for Councillor. Additionally the Maximum for Directed Advertising (i.e. third party support) is \$750 for both Mayor and Councillor positions. More information on that is provided in the candidates information package.

Council has appointed Mr. William Halstead as Chief Election Officer. He will oversee the election process. Lisa Clark, Deputy Chief Election Officer and Paul Carver, CAO will be available to assist with the nomination process and receive nomination papers.

2018 Village Council Election Update

The 2018 Local Government Election for Mayor and Council will take place on Saturday October 20, 2018 from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Advance Voting will be held Wednesday October 10th. Both will be at the Village Office from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

NOMINATIONS:

If you are considering running for Council, nomination papers will be available shortly. Nominations can be submitted from 9:00 a.m. Tuesday, September 4th to 4:00 p.m. Friday, September 14th. Persons unable to deliver nomination papers by hand, mail or other delivery service to the Chief Election Officer during that time can submit completed nomination papers by fax or email, provided the originals are received by Friday, September 14th @ 4:00 p.m.

Elections BC has produced several documents to assist individual voters, persons considering running for office, or those supporting a candidate. A limited supply of printed copies are available at the Village Office. They are also available online on the Ministry of Community, Sport and Cultural Development website at www.cscd.gov.bc.ca/lgd/elections/home.htm.

QUALIFICATIONS TO RUN FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT OFFICE

To qualify as a candidate for local government office, at the time of nomination a person must meet the following criteria:

1. be 18 years of age or older on general voting day
2. be a Canadian Citizen
3. been a resident of British Columbia for at least six months prior to the day nomination papers are filed
4. not be disqualified by any enactment from voting or be otherwise disqualified by law
5. be nominated by two persons that are eligible electors of the Village
6. person being nominated is not required to be a resident or a non-resident property elector of the Village.

VOTING ELIGIBILITY

There are two categories of electors for local government elections in British Columbia:

1. Resident Electors must:

- be 18 years of age or older on general voting day
- be a Canadian Citizen
- have been a resident of British Columbia for at least six months prior to the day of registering to vote
- been a resident of the Village for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registering to vote
- not be disqualified by any enactment from voting or be otherwise disqualified by law.

2. Non-Resident Property Electors must:

- be 18 years of age or older on general voting day
- be a Canadian Citizen
- have been a resident of British Columbia for at least six months prior to the day of registering to vote
- have been a registered owner of real property in the Village for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registering to vote



Mayors Update July 2018

Let me begin with some information that Council has brought forward from closed session to public forum.

1. The owner of the mall made a request to Council for approval to delay the opening of the grocery store until the end of the year. At a Special Meeting held on June 28th, Council passed the following resolution:
"That the Revitalization Tax Exemption Certificate for 0955047 B.C. Ltd. be cancelled if the Phase Two improvements are not completed by July 31, 2018".

A letter to that effect was issued to the owner of the property.

2. The Contract for the Water Treatment Plant and Reservoir has finally been awarded. At a Special Meeting held on June 28th, Council passed the following resolution:

That the Design-Build Contract to construct the Water Treatment Plant, Reservoir and associated civil/site works be awarded to Global Water Partners in the amount of \$2,513,568; and

That \$445,954 be transferred from Accumulated Surplus to off-set the increase in project costs.

Through re-scoping of the project, it became necessary for the Village to contribute \$445,954 towards the cost of the project. These funds will come from Accumulated Surplus. As this will essentially be a lump-sum Contract, we shouldn't expect to see any additional costs above what was awarded to the contractor. Municipal staff will monitor the project closely throughout the construction schedule. Our CAO has over 30 years of engineering and construction experience on a wide array of projects. Construction of these assets is expected to be completed in the spring of 2019. Decommission of the dam is expected in the summer of 2019.

Bonding has been secured from the contractor to provide assurances that the project will be fully completed under the terms of the Contract.

I want to be clear to Sayward residents that no funds were borrowed, nor do we expect the need to borrow funds for this much needed and critical project.

At the upcoming UBCM Convention this fall, our CAO and I will discuss with the Premier and our Minister the problems we experienced funding this project (and the need to transfer funds from Accumulated Surplus), to determine if an alternate funding source is available for us to tap into to obtain reimbursement of all, or a portion of the additional \$445,954 that we had to make available for this project.

3. The new Library: The Library will now be located south of the Kelsey Centre, in the grassed area on the south side of the parking lot (between School and Kelsey Centre). The reason for the change in location was the large tree at the original location. An arborist hired by the Vancouver Island Regional Library determined the roots of the tree would not survive the construction of a building at this location.
4. At the Strathcona Regional District (SRD) meeting on June 18, the Board approved Bylaws 321 and 322 to go to an Alternative Approval Process (AAP). The AAP form is available on the Strathcona Regional Website, but you only need to complete one if you are not in favour of those Bylaws. Through Bylaws 321 and 322, the SRD is proposing to seek electoral approval for the establishment of a service for providing infrastructure through the Connected Coast Project, as well as authorization to borrow \$6 million (if required). The \$6 million would be required to cover projected short-term operating deficits and possible project cost overruns.

The AAP will run from July 23 to September 4, 2018. While no action is required if you are in support of those Bylaws, you will need to complete the APP form and return it to the SRD prior to September 4, 2018 if you are not in support of those Bylaws. The APP must be returned to the SRD office located at 990 Cedar St. Campbell River. You may also request an email copy of the AAP by contacting the SRD at 250-830-6700.

- Park Pond Aerator – Installed June 2018. Not doing the job it was intended. Staff will review other ways to control the algae. Applying for grant to have a consult done.
- Roads, Grounds and Gardens – Ongoing.
- Gazebo – Gravel handicap access complete. Concrete ramp and handrails in 2019.

Strathcona Regional District (Area 'A')

July 20, 2018

Housing Service

At the July board meeting a motion was passed to undertake a feasibility study for establishing a Regional Housing Service for the Strathcona Regional District. The intent of those hoping to create this new service is to raise property taxes in order to subsidize the cost of housing for low income families. Although I believe there is a genuine need for subsidized housing, I also believe that this problem is the responsibility of the provincial government and should not be funded through our local property taxes. This is just one more example of the provincial government attempting to download their costs onto local government. Therefore, in opposition to this initiative I have stated that Area 'A' would not participate in any new regional housing service. Although other electoral areas agree with me on this, most municipalities do not and this is why these kinds of motion usually are passed by the board.

Pending Litigation

As a matter of principle regarding my opposition to a regional housing service, let me tell you about the pending court litigation against the Strathcona Regional District and the City of Campbell River. Electoral Area 'D' (Oyster River Area) entered into a joint service agreement with Campbell River to be supplied with bulk water for their residents. Afterwards, Campbell River passed a municipal bylaw to the effect that anyone who didn't live within their municipal boundary must pay double the cost they charge their own residents for water. This means that the avg. Area 'D' home must pay approx. \$1150.00 per year just for water alone. The Strathcona Regional District, which is dominated by Municipal Directors, passed a motion to enforce these costs onto Electoral Area 'D'. In response, an Area 'D' resident, on behalf of his community has stepped forward and challenged these rates and bylaws in court. This seems the only option available for any Electoral Area involved in a joint service agreement dispute.

It is important to understand that all financial votes at the Regional District are weighted. This means that each Campbell River Director who represents a large population has multiple votes compared to the single vote every other Director has. This gives Campbell River almost complete control. This fact, plus the kind of behaviour exhibited by Campbell River as I have described above, are just two of the many reasons why I would never want us (Area 'A') to enter into any regional service, or any joint service, with Campbell River.

Alternate Approval Process (APP) for the High Speed Internet Project

The SRD Board approved Bylaws 321 and 322 to go to an Alternative Approval Process (instead of holding a full referendum), which is intended to seek electoral approval for the establishment of a service to provide broadband infrastructure through the Connected Coast project as well as the authorization to borrow up to \$6 million, if required, to cover projected short-term operating deficits and possible project cost overruns. This borrowing, which is kind of "liability insurance" for the Province, is demanded by the Provincial Government as a condition for this project to proceed. I do not anticipate that any of this loan will be spent, or that any tax requisition will be levied as a result of it, and I am in support of this project.

The APP process will be advertised in local newspapers, and response forms made available. The bottom line is that if 10% of the electorate register their opposition, then a full referendum would be required. If, on the other hand, electors are in support of these Bylaws, then they do not need to fill in a response form or take any other action.
