With snow covering the ground there is not much for gardeners to do. But a brief thaw might allow an opportunity to slip in a few bulbs for spring blooms. There may be a chance for the asparagus beds to be weeded and the dry stems to be cut off. A layer of compost will ensure a good crop of asparagus in the spring.

Seed catalogs provide a good chance to plan for spring plantings. The catalogs provide information on growing practices and the special characteristics of different varieties. Hybrid seeds are more expensive but often have greater vigor than open pollinated (non-hybrid) types. If you want to save your own seeds you will need to stick to the open pollinated varieties (designated O.P.) as hybrid seeds will not provide reliable seeds. Most seeds will remain vital for several years if stored in a mouse proof container and kept cool and dry.

Each year the garden club makes a cooperative vegetable seed order, ordering seeds in larger quantities and dividing them into individual packages. This can cut our seed costs by half and provides a good quantity of seeds for one year's planting. The January meeting will begin this process by surveying the members regarding their preferences.

The meeting will also feature a discussion of winter gardening. Members will share their experiences of growing year round both in the garden and in the greenhouse. Discussions of this kind share the local experience of our members with everyone learning something from the exchange. Our meetings are always on the second Thursday of the month at 7:00 at the Heritage Hall. Everyone is welcome to join us on January 11.




