2018 Watering Restrictions Now in Effect

The Village of Sayward is implementing watering restrictions. Authority to restrict water usage is set out in Water Regulation Bylaw No. 391.

The following water restrictions are effective from May 23, 2018 to September 30, 2018;

Watering is only permitted between the following hours:

6 AM to 10AM; and 6 PM to 10 PM

Even Numbered Homes, Apartment and Condo Buildings, Mobile Homes, etc.

Residences with address numbers ending in an even number (e.g. 110 Dyer Dr.), watering is allowed on even days of the month (July 24, 26, 28, 30, etc.).

Odd Numbered Homes, Apartment and Condo Buildings, Mobile Homes, etc.

Residences with address numbers ending in an odd number (e.g. 111 Dyer Dr.), watering is allowed on odd days of the month (July 23, 25, 27, 29 etc.).

These restrictions are intended to ensure that ALL residents receive an adequate supply of water throughout the summer months and that sufficient reserve supplies are available should they be required for emergency fire fighting purposes.

PLEASE NOTE: Parking lot, driveway, and car washing is only permitted between 6 AM to 10 AM and 6 PM to 10 PM on your designated watering days.

Garden Club News

What a great time for gardens! Unlike the last few years, we have had enough spring rain and with sunnier weather everything grows like crazy. That includes weeds. So gardeners slap on the sunscreen and their hats and go after those weeds while they are small.

Deadheading flowers means cutting off the spent blooms. If the plant is allowed to set seeds on a few drying flowers it will slow down or stop forming new blooms. Some flowers tend to make a single bloom to start with. You can enjoy that first colour for a bit, then cut it off to encourage multiple blooms to come. Roaming around with scissors in the cool of the evening combines enjoyment of the colour along with a little "hair cutting".

Onions have short root systems and will get a boost if you top dress them with compost followed by a good watering. At the same time you can snap off any of the flowers that tend to form on onions grown from sets.

Some club members will be getting together on the Friday before Canada Day to build our entry in the parade. If you want to help, please phone Alex at 282-3799. The club will also be organizing a Fall Fair at the Heritage Hall on September 15 during and after the summer market. This will be a non-competitive display of vegetables, flowers, canning, jam, flowers, and animals. Watch for a list of categories and display suggestions.

The Garden Club plants and maintains the flower boxes at your mail boxes. During the dry season the boxes need lots of water. When you go for your mail you can bring along a milk jug of water to help the thirsty plants. Hope you have fun in the sun.

NDP Statement on World Elder Abuse Awareness Day

NDP Seniors Critic Rachel Blaney (North Island – Powell River) made the following statement on World Elder Abuse

"Seniors have the right to enjoy their later years in comfort and dignity, but too many still find themselves in a vulnerable place in Canada. It's devastating that abuse affects up to 10 percent of our elder adults, and only 1 in 5 of these abuses will come to the attention of someone who can help.

There are many challenges – income insecurity, unaffordable housing, social isolation – often made worse when they leave their home and communities. In these circumstances, the risk of elder abuse and negligence increases.

The NDP applauds caregivers and volunteers working with our seniors every day. However, by the year 2036, just one generation from now, 1 in 4 Canadians will be a senior, yet the Liberals have no plan in place to deal with this enormous challenge facing our country.

That is why the NDP is calling for a comprehensive national senior's strategy delivered by a dedicated Department for Seniors. The strategy would deliver effective programs and services for all, especially the most vulnerable, as well as address physical and financial abuse.

Canadians deserve strong social programs to secure a dignified retirement and enjoy their later years."

Finger Dock Closure

Sayward Futures Society is obligated to have a wharf inspection every five years. The inspection was done over this Spring and we recently received the completed report, which determined that the lower finger dock and the breakwater pilings are in very poor condition and deemed a public safety hazard.

In consultation with the engineer Ralph Watts, from North Island Engineering, and Joe McAlister, from Tuff Marine Repairs,

THE FINGER DOCK IS TEMPORARILY CLOSED TO PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC AND BOAT MOORAGE UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

SFS is awaiting cost estimates on three options:

- 1. Complete removal of the dock and breakwater;
- 2. Repair of the existing dock and breakwater; or
- 3. Replacing the dock and repairing the breakwater.

Once we receive the estimates, we will make a decision on proceeding.

In the meantime, in order to maintain public safety, we cannot provide moorage or pedestrian access to the finger dock. Moorage may be available at the nearby Small Craft Harbour.

SAYWARD COMMUNITY BURSARY

INFORMATION, REQUIREMENTS & APPLICATION

The purpose of the Sayward Community Bursary is to reward deserving, well-rounded students and to assist them in their post secondary education.

Applicants:

- Must have resided at least one year in Sayward
- Must have a parent residing in Sayward at the time of the application
- Must show proof of acceptance in a post secondary program
- May apply annually for five years following secondary school completion

Applications should include:

- A letter of introduction written by the applicant, including some personal history
- A list of community activities and/or volunteer services, along with letters or reference
- A transcript of marks for grades 11 and 12
- An indication of future education plans
- Any other pertinent information

Please submit applications to the Sayward Community Bursary Committee by **August 17**th of the school year in which you will be taking post secondary courses.

Please note: Students are encouraged to update their applications by August 17th each following year, with transcripts of marks, indication of future education plans and any other pertinent information, in order to qualify for further monies should they become available.

Sayward Community Bursary Committee

The Sayward Bursary Committee shall be composed of one representative from each of the contributing organizations or households. A representative from a contributing youth organization must be an adult. A person with a direct relationship with an applicant may not sit as a representative on the Committee. Contributors are requested to deposit their donations with the Sayward Bursary Committee by September 1st in order to facilitate planning.

Bursary Criteria

The committee will select bursary recipients as soon as possible after school starts in the fall. Alternates may also by chosen, in case an original recipient does not begin his/her post secondary courses as planned. The committee will issue the Bursary monies in two instalments of equal amounts.

The first cheque will be issued to the student as soon as possible after October 15th, once either a letter of acceptance or proof of registration is received.

The second cheque will be issued as soon as possible after February 15th, with confirmation to the Committee that the student is still attending school.

If the student does not begin the second term of post secondary education, the second cheque will be withheld and awarded to an alternate.

In the event that the bursary is not awarded to a student beginning his/her post secondary education, the Committee will meet to select recipients from previous applicants who have submitted updated letters of application.
