## **Clinic Corner News**

The BC Cancer Society is promoting the Walk or Run to Quit Program.

This uses walking and/or running to help people stop smoking. Why does it work?

Exercise helps people cope with cravings, goal setting and monitoring help with behavior change, exercise helps with weight loss, and it uses an evidence based smoking cessation curriculum.

There are 3 different programs they offer: In-Store Training Programs, Virtual Training Program or Train on Your Own Challenge. The In-store training program and Virtual training program each have a fee involved. The Train on Your Own challenge is free. If you register for any of these three options and you quit smoking, you are eligible to win prizes including cash. Full contest details and program registration found at <u>runtoquit.com</u>

Registration for the Spring program is currently underway and deadline is May 15, 2018, cost is \$ 30.00. To help support this program, join the Sayward Primary Healthcare Clinic's Walking Program. ### Garden Club News

Hopefully by the time you read this west coast spring will have arrived while the rest of the country continues to shiver. Ambitious gardeners are already starting seeds indoors or in greenhouses for transplanting within this month. As soon as the ground warms up a bit it is possible to plant peas but they need to be protected with a crop cover cloth like remay to keep the birds from taking out the small plants.

Now is the narrow window of opportunity for spraying fruit trees with lime sulphur / dormant oil spray. The oil component smothers some pest organisms but can be harmful to the tree once the buds have begun to open so you can't delay spraying for very long now. A dry warm day will allow the spray to dry before evening. The lime sulphur without the oil can also be applied later in the year. This is an acceptable organic gardening practice.

The last garden club meeting heard a presentation by Zac Kregosky on xeriscaping, the practice of gardening and landscaping with limited summer water in mind. Choices around locations, species, composting, mulching and more can help make a garden that requires less water and less work. The meeting also did planning work around our collective seed order and members were able to choose from the seeds donated by Sandra. Thanks Sandra, that is a big saving to our members.

The next meeting of the club will be on Thursday, March 8 and will feature our potluck dinner which will begin at 5:30 to be followed by our regular meeting which includes our usual round table discussion of what our members are up to in their gardens and questions that other members often have answers for. We also have our opportunity table that has plants, cuttings and seeds donated by members that are available for a small financial contribution to the club. Members are reminded to save some plant divisions to bring in for the table. New members are always welcome to the club and there is no membership fee. Hope to see you there.



## SAYWARD TOURISM COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Heritage Hall was abuzz on February 7<sup>th</sup> when the Tourism committee and Sayward Futures sponsored a second meeting to complete the public consultation on tourism in the Sayward Valley. #### **Job Summary**

The Coordinator provides leadership in the development and delivery of operational, and community preparedness efforts, as well as delivering emergency response coordination for the Village as needed.
