2018 Watering Restrictions Now in Effect

The Village of Sayward is implementing watering restrictions. Authority to restrict water usage is set out in Water Regulation Bylaw No. 391.

The following water restrictions are effective from May 23, 2018 to September 30, 2018;

Watering is only permitted between the following hours:

6 AM to 10AM; and 6 PM to 10 PM

Even Numbered Homes, Apartment and Condo Buildings, Mobile Homes, etc.

Residences with address numbers ending in an even number (e.g. 110 Dyer Dr.), watering is allowed on even days of the month (Sept 24, 26, 28, 30, etc.).

Odd Numbered Homes, Apartment and Condo Buildings, Mobile Homes, etc.

Residences with address numbers ending in an odd number (e.g. 111 Dyer Dr.), watering is allowed on odd days of the month (Sept 23, 25, 27, 29 etc.).

These restrictions are intended to ensure that ALL residents receive an adequate supply of water throughout the summer months and that sufficient reserve supplies are available should they be required for emergency fire fighting purposes.

PLEASE NOTE: Parking lot, driveway, and car washing is only permitted between 6 AM to 10 AM and 6 PM to 10 PM on your designated watering days.

Finger Dock Closure

Sayward Futures Society is obligated to have a wharf inspection every five years. The inspection was done over this Spring and we recently received the completed report, which determined that the lower finger dock and the breakwater pilings are in very poor condition and deemed a public safety hazard.

In consultation with the engineer Ralph Watts, from North Island Engineering, and Joe McAlister, from Tuff Marine Repairs,

THE FINGER DOCK IS TEMPORARILY CLOSED TO PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC AND BOAT MOORAGE UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

SFS is awaiting cost estimates on three options:

1. Complete removal of the dock and breakwater;
2. Repair of the existing dock and breakwater; or
3. Replacing the dock and repairing the breakwater.

Once we receive the estimates, we will make a decision on proceeding.

In the meantime, in order to maintain public safety, we cannot provide moorage or pedestrian access to the finger dock. Moorage may be available at the nearby [Small Craft Harbour](#).





Mayors Update Aug 2018

Since my last update the Village has been moving along with business as usual.

There have been some interesting rumours floating around the village, some negative and some positive. However, before I begin, I must state that Mayor and Council supports all municipal employees. There is not one employee who has all the answers, nor have I known any employee to be disrespectful to a customer. Unless someone walks in the shoes of our employees, I see no reason for anyone to complain. That being said, should anyone have a complaint, please fill out a complaint form (available online or at the Municipal Office) and submit the complaint to our CAO, who will investigate.

As most of you are aware, we as a community must be Bear Aware. The reason why I mention this is some fishermen continue to clean fish and promptly deposit the remnants into their gardens or compost piles. This not only attracts bears, but other rodents such as raccoons, rats and mice. Please consider cleaning your fish before bringing them home and dispose of the undesirable parts back into the ocean for other sea life to feast on.

I am pleased to advise that water is still going over the dam. So, it appears that our water restrictions are doing what we intended them to do. A full reservoir behind that dam is required to provide full fire protection to our community.

So, what happened to the pond this summer.....It would seem that the aeration system installed by staff this summer did not stop the growth of algae. This after staff investigated the problem and acted on the guidance of professionals and other communities. It would seem then that this approach was not the right solution for our pond. Our CAO is further investigating the problem to see what other corrective measures are available. A Project Development grant application has been made to the Rural Dividend Program to continue with this investigation.

Just a quick reminder of the Chili Cook-Off on Sunday, September 2nd. **The venue for this years' inaugural event has been changed from the Gazebo to the Kelsey Centre.** Silent auction items will be set up around 11:30 am. The cook-off and tasting will run from 2:30 pm. to 5:00 pm and there will be a live auction starting at 3:30 pm. This will be a fun day for everyone, with live music. All funds raised will go to Tour de Rock, Cops for Cancer, a very worthwhile cause.

Village Projects:

Working Waterfront Trail – Phase one trail completion fall of 2018.

Mall Store – No response from owner about Council resolution to cancel Tax Exemption Certificate.

Water Treatment Plant – Contract issued, work in progress.

Dam Decommissioning – Ongoing, expected completion fall of 2019.

Park Pond Aerator – Installed June 2018 and is not doing the job expected. Will be looking at other options to control the algae. Applied for grant to continue investigation.

Roads, Grounds and Gardens – Ongoing.

Gazebo – Concrete ramp and handrails to be installed in 2019.
