Consequences of the Decision to Shut Down Salmon Farming in the Discovery Islands

- BCSFA represents 70 members involved in the business of Salmon Farming, primarily on B.C.'s coast.
- Salmon Farming supports nearly 6,500 well-paid jobs in rural coastal communities.
- Every Salmon farmer in B.C. has been certified by at least one third-party organization, such as the Aquaculture Stewardship Council.
- Farm-raised salmon is climate friendly protein, producing far less Carbon Dioxide than beef, pork, or chicken.

Damage Overview

Below data outlines the topline potential impacts to B.C. coastal communities over the next 18-months

- Potentially **1,535** B.C. Jobs Gone

 Average loss of more than \$79,000 in salary and benefits per family
- **\$386.6 Million** Economic Output
- **→** \$139.1 Million GDP
- **\$21.5 Million** in Annual Tax Revenue
- → 267 Suppliers of Goods & Services Impacted
- → \$20.47 Million Spending on Suppliers
- → Up to 10.7 Million Salmon Euthanized, a loss of \$170 million in value

24% of B.C.'s Salmon Aquaculture sector could be wiped out

Immediate Decision Impacts

The impacts of the Discovery Islands decision are immediate, as companies are forced into near-term actions based on the 18-month time horizon.

- → Layoffs will begin in mid-February 2021
- Freeze on planned investments: Shortly following the Minister's decision, investment plans were put on hold by head offices.
- Termination of commercial or benefits agreements: Existing commercial or benefits agreements in the Discovery Islands will be terminated.
- **Euthanizing of salmon:** Unless an extension to the 18-month deadline is granted and/or fish at various growth stages can grow at 10.7 million fish will have to be euthanized.

Ripple Effect

B.C.'s Salmon Aquaculture sector is a dynamic and integrated network of businesses working together to raise and distribute world-class healthy affordable protein.

The Discovery Islands decision significantly impacts direct, indirect, induced employment, including 267 goods and services suppliers.


