

Sayward RCMP December Report

With winter being upon us, and colder temperatures, we would like to remind everyone that Highway 19 from Campbell River north to Port Hardy, and Highway 28 to Gold River are designated as Winter Tires and/or Chains routes. For most folks driving a car, SUV, or pickup truck it means you must use winter tires marked M+S.

The following events occurred and are unsolved. The RCMP would be interested in any information that could further these files.

Sometime around September 15th, someone broke into Sayward Village recycling location, causing some damage, Sayward file 2021-405.

September 17th, tools and wood stolen from Sayward Burial Park, Sayward file 2021-406.

September 21st, someone broke the lock and stole cash box from a local farm stand on the Island Highway, Sayward file 2021-408.

There has been reports of theft of catalytic converters from Eve River log sort area, Sayward file 2021-428.

It appears there has been a rise of suspicious occurrences, and some thefts from properties in Sayward valley and the village. This behavior and actions by some only create divide between residents, and cause grief where it should not be. Always make sure that you are securing your valuables, and keep an eye open for suspicious people that would lurk where they do not belong.

Bicycles, and Helmets: helmets are mandatory when riding a bicycle. Failure to wear one could result in a contravention of no less than \$29 issued to the rider. Also wearing bright or reflective colors on evenings and nighttime is essential for everyone's safety. The bicycle helmet regulation will be enforced, wear an approved bicycle helmet if you are riding.

Strathcona Regional District (Area 'A')

The Royal Canadian Legion, Sayward Branch:

It is my pleasure to announce that I have budgeted \$50,000.00 for the Sayward Legion to pay for renovations to the building and upgrades to the kitchen and plumbing. I have sourced all of this money from the Federal Government's Community Works Fund at no cost whatsoever to Area 'A' taxpayers. Our local Legion Hall is an important asset for all of us and has been a vibrant part of our community for many years. I am delighted that Area 'A' can assist in this way to get our Legion functioning again to its full potential for many more years to come.

Comox Strathcona Regional Hospital District:

This item keeps coming back every year. The background is that local governments are responsible to fund 40% of the capital costs of acute care facilities (hospitals), and the province is responsible for 60% of those costs plus 100% of all long-term care facilities. Therefore, our Hospital Board raised our tax requisition on a one project basis to \$12.6 M per year to pay for our two new hospitals, one in Comox and one in Campbell River. These hospitals will be completely paid for by 2028. Unfortunately and against our will, Island Health which has complete control, built these hospitals with less beds than required to accommodate the current patient load and therefore they are already over capacity. Their solution is now to build a 150 bed long-term care (LTC) facility in Campbell River, and move the patients who do not require acute care out of the hospital and into LTC in order to reduce the over capacity in the hospital. That is a good thing to do because it costs the province \$1,000.00 per day to keep a patient in the hospital as opposed to \$250.00 in LTC.

But the catch is that Island Health wants us to pay 40% of this LTC facility which is clearly 100% a provincial responsibility. This is big time downloading of provincial costs onto our property taxes. At our CSRHD board meeting of Nov 18, I argued against this. One of my points was that by moving just one patient from acute care to LTC the province would save \$750.00 per day which over 4 years would equal over a \$1M. By moving 50 patients the province will pocket over \$50M which is more than enough to build their 150 bed LTC unit. Therefore, they have no need at all to pressure us to subsidize the LTC facility which is their sole responsibility to undertake. Unfortunately, the majority of the Board seem all too willing not only to keep our extremely high tax requisition but also to deplete our hospital reserve funds in order to accommodate Island Health's request. At the very least they have a moral obligation to seek consent from our constituents and this is another point that I will continue to push. On Nov 18 they passed a motion, "THAT the Comox Strathcona Regional Hospital District Board direct that further assessment and analysis be undertaken, in partnership with Island Health, to explore the required policies, agreements and financial plans for (among other things): supporting a long-term care facility in Campbell River". Area 'D' and I were the only two Directors to vote against it. This motion is only a preliminary step, but in my opinion a step in the wrong direction.





Light up Sayward


Join us for our first annual Light up the Village and Valley of Sayward! For a fun filled, family evening for everyone.
