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Garden Club News

Now is the time to make sure that they are removed before they spread their seeds to give you a new generation of weeds for years to come.

Now is also the time to plant winter cover crops. Fall rye and peas can shade out new weeds and preserve soil fertility. Covering the seeds with at least two inches of soil will keep them away from birds like the Stellar's Jays who love to steal them.

Sayward Emergency Preparedness Corner



Here are some items to help you ensure you have prepared yourself and any family members residing with you for some of the main types of emergency situations.

- Identify and address each person or pet's functional needs relative to communications, medications, independence, supervision, and transportation.
- Have a 'Grab and Go' kit with survival essentials available for each person.
- Have a communication and reunion plan for members of the same household.
- Have important phone contact numbers available with each person at all times.
- Have 3.5 litres (7 Gallons) of clean drinking water stored and available for each person.
- Have emergency food supplies available for each person and any pets. Food that will keep, can be stored without cooling, and can be eaten without heating.
- Make sure each person knows how to turn off home utilities if needed. Examples water, gas, electricity.
- Make sure each person can quickly locate a working flashlight if needed.
- Have a first aid kit available to all persons and ideally a small one in each person's "Grab and Go' kit.
- Have a battery powered or hand wind up charge AM/FM radio available to listen for any public broadcast emergency announcements.
- Have a whistle for each person to signal for assistance if needed.
- Make it a practice for every person to always fully recharge/refuel personal electric devices and transportation vehicles when they are down to 50% of capacity.

SAYWARD FOLK MUSIC ~ SEPTEMBER 11TH

Kevin Mitchell ~ Sunday, September 11th ~ 7:00pm ~ The Visitors Centre



Kevin Mitchell plays and sings songs that, have the feel of a far off Woody Guthrie era, mixed with a contemporary roots vibe. "Country/Roots music that is organic in all the best traditions of folk. Playing acoustic guitar and singing about real stuff." Prairie born and raised, Mitchell has been on the west coast for 30 years.

In the vein of Alt Country Roots, Folk and Blues, his songs are honest, engaging and performed with a unique style that plays like a band with strong rhythms and uniquely original lyrics that combine for a refreshing original sound.

Mitchell's songs conjure up vivid imagery and metaphors that speak to the social and cultural issues that our planet is currently facing. He shares stories about salt of the earth people, remote corners of the country, and forgotten relics from his prairie roots, to life living on a Gulf Island on BC's west coast. The Nature Trust of British Columbia, K'ómoks First Nation and Department of Fisheries and Oceans will be undertaking a restoration project within the Salmon River Estuary, more specifically, along the public accessible Estuary Trail. The focus of this project is to restore the natural tidal processes within the estuary by breaching the trail in 2 locations where tide channels once flowed through the salt marsh meadows but are now bisected and restricted by the trail or causeway.

Once used for vehicle access across the estuary, this causeway is currently a popular walking trail and a great location for wildlife viewing. The causeway now sustains pockets of well-established mature trees and riparian habitat that is found to be beneficial to the estuary and area in general. However, such a large structure bisecting the estuary and restricting tidal inundation can be problematic for the overall health and productivity of the estuary. Estuaries and coastal wetlands are among the most important ecosystems, supporting more than 80% of coastal wildlife but make up only 3% of the coast line on Vancouver Island.

This project will comprise of breaching this causeway and excavating down to the natural tidal channel elevations to restore this movement of water. The breaches we construct with this project will be free-flowing, approximately 5m wide at the channel base but may not be holding water at low tides as fish typically move/feed during high tides when the estuary is flooded. One breach location is targeting a culvert installed more recently but now showing signs of failure due to the harsh salt marsh conditions and will only cause further restrictions by collecting woody debris, blocking fish passage and eventually collapsing. Locations and access were carefully selected to avoid damage to the surrounding forest and habitat that is now found on the causeway, environmental monitors will be onsite through the duration of the project ensuring the protection of this sensitive area.

Two clear-span aluminum pedestrian bridges will be installed over the breaches to allow trail use and wildlife viewing to resume along the route – similar to the bridge at Kelly's Trail. The project duration is currently planned from August 22nd 2022 to September 01st 2022. During this time, the trail and public access will be closed and we ask for all members of the public to please respect the work site until public access is resumed. We ask for all visitors to please respect the conservation area by staying on the designated trails and keeping dogs on leash at all times. Regardless of size, shape or obedience, the presence of dogs disturbs wildlife or can have negative impacts on the sensitive ecosystems found within the Salmon River Estuary.
