

Emergency Phone Notification System

The Village of Sayward in conjunction with the Strathcona Regional District uses **Alertable** as our public emergency mass notification service.

Alertable can notify residents, visitors, and businesses of emergencies in a timely manner to people who subscribe to receive these alerts. It can also be used to notify residents of other non-emergency items such as scheduled road closures, power outages, water and sewer alerts, and much more. This service is free.

The system is compatible with mobile phones, tablets, computers or smart speakers. It can also send alerts via text message, voice calls to land lines, and e-mail.

Emergency Preparedness Corner



May the Power of May Flowers be with you as you focus on your emergency preparedness.

Here's some numbered reminders and tips in no priority order.

- 1. Remember you're #1 for you as you make Emergency Preparedness (EP) a #1 priority for yourself.
- 2. Encourage your family and friends to make EP a #1 priority as well.
- 3. If you haven't updated any first aid accreditation you have or are interested in attaining a first aid level certification, St John's Ambulance runs regular monthly courses in Campbell River that are very affordable.
- 4. Our Sayward Fire Department still has a small number of WASP Kits available for purchase and more information on the kits can be found on their web site. Basically the kit involves sprinklers that can be attached to your roof gutters to water down your house roof in the case of a wild fire where flying sparks can be a risk to starting house fires at the roof of a house even before the fire is very close to that house. Wildfire sparks have been know to travel very long distances in certain wind conditions.
- 5. The Sayward Village Emergency Evacuation Plan is available on the village website.
- 6. The Village of Sayward Community Wildfire Protection Plan is available on the village website.
- 7. Various government funding for community emergency services continues to expand and Sayward will benefit with further improvements in our readiness through equipment expansion of various types.
- 8. Did you know? Family Radio Service Radios (FRS Walkie Talkies) can transmit up to 4 KMs in tough conditions but also up to 50 KMs in areas that are flat or have a direct line between the radios. These radios can be very valuable in many situations including emergencies.
- 9. The Sayward Fire Department is conducting an ongoing fund raiser where you can order some excellent first aid type kits and other useful emergency preparedness items at excellent prices and some of the proceeds of the sales benefit our fire department.
- 10. The Sayward Emergency Services drone has begun testing and practice with a team of local drone licensed emergency services volunteers. The availability of the drone for use only in emergency situations will prove to be a valuable extra tool in our community preparedness.

Walkie Talkies Wonderful – The Sayward Family Radio Services (FRS, also know as "Walkie Talkies") net is conducted by the Sayward Emergency Program Coordinator (EPC) from the Village Office area each Wednesday evening from 6:30PM to 7::00PM on FRS Channel 4. You are encouraged to check in with the Net Controller using your FRS radio. Checking in with the net allows you to verify your radio is charged up and transmitting properly. Channel 4 is on frequency 462.6375 but you just need to select Channel 4 on these simple radios that require no license. We have had a number of people check in regularly from Village and Valley areas and more are encouraged. If the Net Controller is unavailable at that weekly time slot for any reason you can still broadcast and see who else can hear you and respond. Practice Makes Perfect!





GENERAL TIPS

- NO BROKEN PLASTIC FURNITURE (Lawn chairs etc.)
- NO PLASTICS WITHOUT RECYCLING SYMBOL
- NO MASKS OR GLOVES

YARD WASTE DROP OFF AREA

ONLY brush clippings, grass clippings, branches, and leaves are accepted. Please ensure when dropping off materials they are as far to the back of the bins as possible.
