

Emergency Phone Notification System

The Village of Sayward in conjunction with the Strathcona Regional District uses **Alertable** as our public emergency mass notification service.

Alertable can notify residents, visitors, and businesses of emergencies in a timely manner to people who subscribe to receive these alerts. It can also be used to notify residents of other non-emergency items such as scheduled road closures, power outages, water and sewer alerts, and much more. This service is free.

The system is compatible with mobile phones, tablets, computers or smart speakers. It can also send alerts via text message, voice calls to land lines, and e-mail.

Emergency Preparedness Corner



Some 4 letter words have arrived here early this year – RISK, HEAT, FIRE, and a 5 letter related word to round it out – WATER.

Here are some things to consider and be aware of to help protect yourself, your family, and your community:

- 1. The early heat this year has reduced snow packs in the mountains dramatically and so you need to do everything you can to reduce your use of water and follow local water restrictions which are always available on the Village Website.
- 2. Protect your access to fresh water by ensuring that you have a fresh supply stored in accessible containers that will be enough for each person in your home to survive for at least 72 hours in an emergency.
- 3. Follow all fire restrictions to the letter and report anyone observed creating irresponsible fire risk.
- 4. To report a wildfire or irresponsible behaviour that could start a wildfire in British Columbia, please call <u>1 800 663-5555</u> or (*5555 from a cell phone) as soon as possible.
- 5. Make sure you are signed up for the FREE Alertable service so you can receive emergency Alerts direct to your home phone or other device. If you haven't already signed up then go to the Emergency Services section of the Village website to sign up today!
- 6. If an Alert is received about a heightened state of risk, read the information carefully and follow any instructions. Only rely on information available from Alertable and other creditable sources such as, in the case of fire risk, the BC Wildfire Services website or BC's Emergency Management Climate Readiness (EMCR) website. There is also an Information Officer the public can call at the BC Coastal Fire Centre if they have additional questions about a fire situation and the phone number is 250-951-4209 Mon-Fri 8AM to 10PM and Sat & Sun 10AM to 10PM
- 7. Make sure that in additional to yourselves as humans, you also have a plan for your pets or other animals should an evacuation event occur.
- 8. Make sure you have your "GAG BAG" i.e. Grab and Go Bag, stocked and ready to go at all times with the vital items you'll need for at least 72 hours survival.
- 9. Remain calm in any emergency and follow the directions of officials while also helping others where possible.
- 10. Consider joining our Emergency Social Services (ESS) team of volunteers available to support our community in times of emergency. To have a Power Point Presentation emailed to you that has further information about ESS volunteering, call or send a text to your Sayward EPC at 250-898-7067 with your request and your email address.

Attain a Walkie Talkie (FRS Radio) and call in on Channel 4 on Wednesday's from 6:30PM to 7:00PM to check your radio operation with others using and monitoring that Channel 4 station at that time.

2023 Watering Restrictions

The Village of Sayward is implementing watering restrictions. Authority to restrict water usage is set out in Water Regulation Bylaw No. 391.

The following water restrictions are effective from June 15, 2023, to September 30, 2023:

Watering is only permitted between the following hours on your designated day:

6 AM to 10 AM; and 6 PM to 10 PM

Residences with address numbers ending in an even number (e.g. 110 Dyer Dr.), watering is allowed on even days of the month (June 24, 26, 28, 30, etc.).

Residences with address numbers ending in an odd number (e.g. 111 Dyer Dr.), watering is allowed on odd days of the month (June 23, 25, 27, 29 etc.).

These restrictions are intended to ensure that ALL residents receive an adequate supply of water throughout the summer months and that sufficient reserve supplies are available should they be required for emergency firefighting purposes.

PLEASE NOTE: The washing of parking lots, driveways, automobiles, boats etc. is discouraged, and if pursued, is only permitted on the residents' designated days before 10:00 am and after 6:00 pm.

PUBLIC NOTICE 2023 PERMISSIVE TAX EXEMPTIONS

Council is beginning the process for considering Permissive Tax Exemptions for the 2023 taxation year.

A permissive tax exemption is a means for Council to support organizations within the community which further Council's objectives of enhancing quality of life (economic, social, cultural) and delivering services economically. A policy guide is available to help identify organizations that meet Council's objectives.

The Policy and application are available at the Village office or on our website. Applications must be received at the Village by August 1st to be considered for 2023.

WFP's Mid Island Forest Operation is planning to chemically brush 4 blocks totaling approximately 41.9 hectares within TFL 39 Block 2 between July 24th and October 31st, 2023 using a basal bark application of Triclopyr Ester. Target species are Red Alder, Cottonwood, and Big Leaf Maple. Basal bark treatment is a selective, precise, and highly effective method of application which utilizes a low volume of herbicide.

The closest community to the plan area is Sayward, which is protected within the herbicide exclusion zone (HEZ). The HEZ (9,380 hectares) was developed in 2015 with input from Sayward and Campbell River residents and captures water intakes, the community watershed, the Salmon Brewster horse trail, and other areas of public sensitivity. Additionally, please note that, as outlined in our Pest Management Plan, blocks with chemical brushing will still have Pesticide Free Zones (PFZs) established along both wet & dry riparian features and the application is subject to weather-based constraints related to wind and precipitation.


