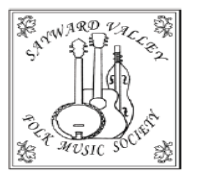

Garden Club News



The snow has come and hopefully gone by the time you read this, giving us a chance to complete some garden tasks, pruning the dead canes out of the raspberries, and mulching the more cold-sensitive plants can keep us outdoors on a pleasant day.

Winter pruning of fruit trees can happen any time in the next few months. Summer pruning is best for removing unwanted growth (suckers, parts of limbs pointing toward the center of the tree, or growth in the center of the tree that impedes air circulation). When growth is taken off in the summer it is less likely to regrow. Winter pruning is for shaping the tree. While shortening a limb choose a bud that is growing in the desired direction and prune back just outside that bud. This encourages the limb to grow in the direction you want.

The December meeting of the club featured our spectacular Christmas potluck dinner. Following our brief business meeting we crafted Christmas decorations from local plant materials. We saw creations of wreaths, swags, table decorations, garden gnomes, and more. Sandra Scarrow showed us how to make wreaths without the use of metal frames. She has a well-developed technique that produces beautiful, bushy wreaths. Thanks, Sandra.

The Garden Club took a break for January but will meet again on the second Thursday of February. The features of the meeting will be swapping and ordering seeds. Members are asked to bring their seed collections for comparison and exchange. We will provide small envelopes for packaging; you can bring along any seed catalogs. Please come and join our friendly group.

Emergency Phone Notification System

The Village of Sayward in conjunction with the Strathcona Regional District uses **Alertable** as our public emergency mass notification service.

Alertable can notify residents, visitors, and businesses of emergencies in a timely manner to people who subscribe to receive these alerts. It can also be used to notify residents of other non-emergency items such as scheduled road closures, power outages, water and sewer alerts, and much more. This service is free.

The system is compatible with mobile phones, tablets, computers or smart speakers. It can also send alerts via text message, voice calls to land lines, and e-mail.

Emergency Preparedness Corner



ROIP is coming to Emergency Services in Sayward –

What is ROIP? The acronym stands for Radio Over Internet Protocol.

Strathcona Regional District has rolled out the system and will be providing training to emergency services people in Sayward and other communities such as Gold River, Tahsis, and more.

This system allows Emergency Services staff and volunteers in communities to easily radio transmit to each other and to the Regional District provided the internet is operating. No need to worry about radio reception levels and the current radio transmission conditions which is called the 'Propagation'.

Another excellent support tool in our local Emergency Preparedness Tool Kit.

Second Seacan Coming –

Again, with the support of the Strathcona Regional District Emergency Services, Sayward will be receiving a second Emergency Supplies Seacan later this year that will be placed behind the Kelsey Centre next to the current Seacan.

This will expand the emergency resources available to the Emergency Social Services support team in both the village and the valley if an emergency is declared and the Sayward Emergency Operations Centre is opened.

Neighbourhood Emergency Preparedness Program (NEPP) Launches in Sayward Feb 07, 2024 !

The Strathcona Regional District has recently rolled out a simplified version of this program and further information is available on the SRD website by searching the site using the name of the program.

A simple guide to how the program works is available on the SRD website and a good start for further information.

The program is designed to help neighbourhood community citizens connect more easily during an emergency as it is frequently people close by who help other people until potential outside emergency help can be received. This simple program allows for more participation by citizens who want to help but are not able to commit to a full Emergency Social Services (ESS) volunteer position.

The Sayward Emergency Program Coordinator (EPC) will be hosting a once-a-month meeting on the NEPP for those interested citizens from the village or the valley. The meeting will be on the **first Wednesday of each month from 7:45PM to 8:45PM in the Sayward Village Council Chambers.**

Note – The first monthly meeting will be on Wednesday Feb 7th at 7:45PM and please note that access to the meeting is only through the Mayor's office door which is the door on the very left of the building from the Village Administration Office public entry door. A sign saying NEPP MEETING HERE will be posted on the glass by the entrance door. Important ! – There may even be free Donuts or other Treats !

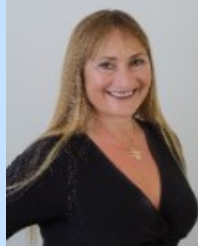

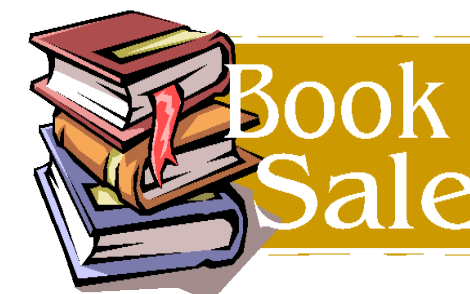

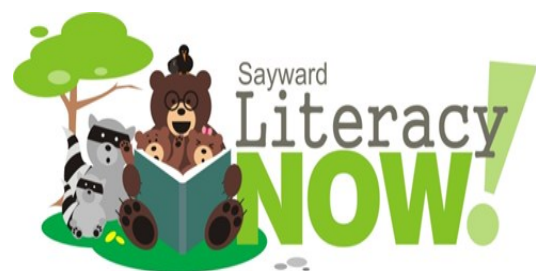
