



READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY BEFORE COMPLETING THE APPLICATION FORM

PERSONAL INFORMATION

- Print applicant's surname and given names in full.
- Print *either* the last 6 digits of the applicant's social insurance number *or* the applicant's birthdate. This information is required pursuant to the *Local Government Act*.

RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS

- Print the applicant's residential address including street number and name, city/town and postal code.

MAILING ADDRESS

- If different from the residential address, print the applicant's mailing address including street number and name, city/town and postal code.

PROPERTY FOR WHICH VOTING ENTITLEMENT IS BEING SOUGHT

- Print the street address or legal description of the applicant's real property in relation to which the applicant is registering. Applicant *must* attach satisfactory proof that they are entitled to register in relation to the real property for which voting entitlement is being sought (e.g., certificate of title, property tax notice, property assessment notice).
- If the land title registration of the real property in relation to which a person is registering under this section indicates that there is more than one individual who is the registered owner of the real property, you must complete and attach the "Non-Resident Property Elector Consent Form". The person may only register as a non-resident property elector with the written consent of those owners who, together with the person registering, constitute a majority of the owners of the property.

SIGNATURES

- Applicant must declare that they meet all the requirements listed in this section to register as a non-resident property elector.
- Applicant must sign the application form in the presence of a witness.
- The witness to the applicant's signature must sign the application form.
- Print residential address of the witness. Not required if the witness is an election official.

IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

- 2 pieces of identification (at least one with a signature) to prove both residency and identity are required.

Acceptable documents include:

- British Columbia Driver's License
- British Columbia ID Card
- British Columbia Services Card
- British Columbia Care Card or Gold Care Card
- ICBC Owner's Certificate of Insurance and Vehicle License
- Utility Bill
- Social Insurance Card
- Citizenship Certificate
- Real property tax notice
- Bank/Credit card or statement

BY SIGNING AND SUBMITTING THIS FORM, YOU ARE DECLARING THAT YOU MEET THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS TO BE REGISTERED AS A NON-RESIDENT PROPERTY ELECTOR:

- you are a Canadian citizen;
- you are age 18 or older or, you will be turning 18 on or before general voting day;
- you have been a resident in B.C. for the past 6 months;
- you do not qualify as a resident elector within the voting jurisdiction;
- you have been an owner of the real property identified above for the past 30 days;
- you have obtained the consent of a majority of the owners of the above described property to be registered as the non-resident property elector for the property;
- you are not currently registered as a non-resident property elector with respect to any other property within the voting jurisdiction; and
- you are not disqualified by any enactment from voting in an election or otherwise disqualified by law.

Note:

- Non-Resident property electors may not vote more than once within a voting jurisdiction regardless of the number of properties owned.
- If more than one person owns a property the person wishing to cast the vote for that property must provide, at the time of registration, written consent from a majority of the property owners.
