# Certified Advanced Bee Keeper Speaks

The mild weather of the past few weeks feels like an early Spring. This is one of the best times of the year for garden clean-up. It's also a great time to plan out where different vegetables should go this year. It's a good idea to avoid planting any of the cabbage family where they have grown in the last two years. This includes cabbage. Broccoli. Brussels sprouts and kale.

The January Garden Club meeting was a big success as many members brought their seed collections. Each member spread out their collection on a separate table and then we took turns going around collecting free seeds from each other. The club provided small paper envelopes to contain the shared seeds. Some of the seeds were from seed companies and some were seeds collected by the club members. When you buy or collect seed it's a good idea to note the year on the package.

At the March 11 meeting we will be pleased to have Danielle Underwood from Muckers Farm share her experience and knowledge of raising bees. Danielle is a certified Advanced Bee Keeper and can help others get a hive started. Our meeting is always on the second Thursday of the month starting at 7:00 at the Heritage Hall. Please join us.

# **Emergency Phone Notification System**

The Village of Sayward in conjunction with the Strathcona Regional District uses **Alertable** as our public emergency mass notification service.

**Alertable** can notify residents, visitors, and businesses of emergencies in a timely manner to people who subscribe to receive these alerts. It can also be used to notify residents of other non-emergency items such as scheduled road closures, power outages, water and sewer alerts, and much more. This service is free.

The system is compatible with mobile phones, tablets, computers or smart speakers. It can also send alerts via text message, voice calls to land lines, and e-mail.

# Neighbourhood Emergency Preparedness Program (NEPP) was Launched in Sayward on Feb 07, 2024!

Thanks to those who attended. The session is the first Wednesday of each month from 7:45PM to 8:45 PM. The next session is Wed March 06, 2024 at 7:45PM.

Here's a recap of previous information and access directions -

The Strathcona Regional District has recently rolled out a simplified version of this program and further information is available on the SRD website by searching the site using the name of the program.

A simple guide to how the program works is available on the SRD website and a good start for further information.

The program is designed to help neighbourhood community citizens connect more easily during an emergency as it is frequently people close by who help other people until potential outside emergency help can be received. This simple program allows for more participation by citizens who want to help but are not able to commit to a full Emergency Social Services (ESS) volunteer position.

The Sayward Emergency Program Coordinator (EPC) will be hosting a once-a-month meeting on the NEPP for those interested citizens from the village or the valley. The meeting will be on the **first Wednesday of each month from 7:45PM to 8:45PM in the Sayward Village Council Chambers.** 

Please note that access to the meeting is only through the Mayor's office door which is the door on the very left of the building from the Village Administration Office public entry door. A sign saying NEPP MEETING HERE will be posted on the glass by the entrance door.

HAM RADIO OPERATORS – FYI – The Sayward EOC has a call sign of VA7 SRU and makes every effort to participate in the EMCR Wed Evening net that starts at 7:15PM on each Wednesday on the Island Trunk System. After EOCs (Emergency Operation Centres) from Vancouver Island have checked in then check ins are taken by the Net Controller from all other HAMs by regional area from North to South. Sayward EOC hopes to hear you on the net at sometime and thanks for your radio skills as always.





# Clinic Corner

Some clarification as to why the clinic is not seeing patients for health issues when they have another provider. This is NOT a decision made by the clinic or Island Health. This is a Provincial decision. The Sayward Community Healthcare Clinic is not a walk in clinic. It is a Primary Care Clinic, which means it provides longitudinal care to patients who have chosen to have the clinic as their primary care provider. BC has developed a Provincial News | Attachment System and a Health Connect Registry to help patients who do not have a primary care provider with connecting to a provider. Through the registries, B.C. will have a comprehensive list of who is looking for a

primary-care provider and who already has one, as well as which providers and clinics can accept new patients. Starting Nov. 30, 2023, and continuing quarterly, the Province will report on progress to add more family doctors and nurse practitioners, and on connecting more patients from the Health Connect Registry to a primary-care provider.

What this means is, you can only have one provider (this does not include specialists). All primary care providers in the province have had to upload their patient panels to a main provincial database. Any patient that is found to have more than one provider (again, not including specialists), will be assigned to whichever provider they have seen the most, or their most recent provider. These patients will then be removed from any other providers panel. This will in turn open up spots for patients that do not have a provider.

What the clinic does offer to ALL residents of Sayward: lab services, holter monitor, ECGs, dressing changes if home nursing is not able to assist, medication injections.


