#### 2024-2028 Financial Plan Presentation

Long Term Financial Planning is the key to a sustainable future for the Village of Sayward.

Each year, the Village develops a balanced budget estimate that determines how much money it needs to spend to provide services for that year and how much revenue it will need to fund those services.

The annual budget is part of the Village's Five-Year Financial Plan that forecasts future budgeting to ensure accountability and service delivery to taxpayers. The plan considers external economic opportunities and pressures and the long-term vision for the Village balanced with the need to provide the essential services that residents rely on every day.

The Financial Plan is guided by Council Strategic Plan which outlines the priorities for the Village that flow into a work plan that guides staff.

Council and Staff are always looking to provide services to the community in the most effective way possible for people who live here now and for those who will in the future.

The main categories of the Village's 2024 Financial Plan:

The revenue budget includes a 10% increase in tax revenue and Council will discuss this evening how that will be distributed between the property classes.

Fees and charges for Water include a 3.0% increase, for Sewer a 3.5% increase and Solid Waste fees a 7.0% increase.

**Update: Appointment of Chief Election Officer and Deputy Chief Election**

#### **PURPOSE**

To appoint a Deputy Chief Election Officer for the purposes of conducting the 2024 Village of Sayward by-election.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Section 58(1) of the Local Government Act (LGA) requires that local governments appoint a Chief Election Officer (CEO) and a Deputy Chief Election Officer (DCEO) to carry out the responsibilities for conducting an election. The LGA also empowers the CEO to appoint election officials required for the administration and conduct of the election.

At its May 7, 2024 Regular meeting, Council resolved the following:

THAT Edith Watson be appointed Chief Election Officer for conducting the 2024 Village of Sayward by-election with power to appoint other election officials as required for the administration and conduct of the 2024 by-election.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The need for Council to appoint a DCEO remains. The Village has a new Finance/Administration Assistant beginning Monday, Trish Malfair. The CAO and Edith Watson have spoken about the opportunity for Trish to fill the DCEO role. Edith has spoken with Trish about the election process and her level of comfort taking on the role. We both agree that Trish possesses the attributes required for the role, and that it will serve Trish and the Village well in the future for her to become familiar with the municipal local government election process now.

The legislative requirement to appoint both a CEO and DCEO is in place should either the CEO or DCEO, for any reason, be unable to carry out their duties outlined in Section 59 (1) and (2) of the LGA.

With the appointment of the CEO approved, and taking into account all the statutory requirements for holding a by-election, the date of the by-election will be Saturday July 20, 2024.

# **STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS**
