





The Village of Sayward in conjunction with the Strathcona Regional District uses **Alertable** as our public emergency mass notification service.

Alertable can notify residents, visitors, and businesses of emergencies in a timely manner to people who subscribe to receive these alerts. It can also be used to notify residents of other non-emergency items such as scheduled road closures, power outages, water and sewer alerts, and much more. This service is free.

The system is compatible with mobile phones, tablets, computers or smart speakers. It can also send alerts via text message, voice calls to land lines, and e-mail.





The Strathcona Regional District recently provided a \$5,000.00 regional grant to aid in the continuation of the Age Friendly Van service. 2025 Watering Restrictions

The Village of Sayward is implementing watering restrictions.

Authority to restrict water usage is set out in Water Regulation Bylaw No. 391. The following water restrictions are effective from July 1, 2025, to September 30, 2025:

Watering* is only permitted between the following hours on your designated day:

6 AM to 10 AM; and

6 PM to 10 PM

Residences with address numbers ending in an even number (e.g. 110 Dyer Dr.), watering is allowed on even days of the month (July 2, 4, 6, 8, etc.).

Residences with address numbers ending in an odd number (e.g. 111 Dyer Dr.), watering is allowed on odd days of the month (July 1, 3, 5, 7 etc.).

These restrictions are intended to ensure that ALL residents receive an adequate supply of water throughout the summer months and that sufficient reserve supplies are available should they be required for emergency firefighting purposes.

PLEASE NOTE: The washing of parking lots, driveways, automobiles, boats etc. is discouraged, and if pursued, is only permitted on the residents' designated days before 10:00 am and after 6:00 pm.

*Watering is defined as using lawn irrigation or the use of a sprinkler, soaker or weeper hoses. Hand watering using watering cans or hoses with automatic shut off valves is currently permitted at any time, on any day.

Garden Club News

The recent rains have revived our gardens and relieved our watering tasks. Now is the time to pay close attention to the details of growing. Our flowers need to have the dead blooms removed. This is called "dead heading" and encourages the plant to put out more blossoms. Some types



like zinnias may get stalled on the first bloom and will concentrate on maturing that flower to seed. Picking that first bloom encourages the plant to branch out and produce more blossoms; as a bonus you get a bouquet for the house.

The vegetable garden always needs some attention. Green beans, cucumbers and zucchinis need constant picking to avoid over mature fruit. Apple trees can be summer pruned and the fruit thinned to assure a crop of good sized apples. If the tree has an over sized crop one year, it may have a poor crop the next year and fall into an every second year habit. This is avoided by thinning the crop to a reasonable size.

Close attention to the details of the garden keeps us in touch with what is happening in the patch. This includes noticing when the slugs get active after the rain. These pests can be controlled with slug traps, slug bait and removing by hand. Early morning and late evening are the best times for slug hunting.

The Garden Club will get back to regular meetings starting with Thursday, September 18 at 7:00 at the Heritage Hall. We plan to have a series of interesting guest speakers this fall and winter. Please join our friendly group.

A campfire ban is in effect for most of the Coastal Fire Centre in British Columbia, starting July 17, 2025, at 12:00 PM. This ban applies to all areas within the Coastal Fire Centre's jurisdiction, with the exception of Haida Gwaii.

The prohibition is being enacted to help prevent human caused wildfires and protect public safety. The ban will remain in effect until October 31, 2025, or until rescinded.

In September, BC Lung Foundation will be visiting Sayward to install a new outdoor air quality monitor through Carter's Project. Carter's Project is an initiative in honour of Carter Vigh, which funds the free distribution of air quality monitors throughout British Columbia.

In the summer of 2023, in 100 Mile House, 9-year-old Carter Vigh sadly passed away due to an asthma attack exacerbated by poor air quality. The nearest air quality monitoring station was 100km away; the skies were clear, but the air over 100 Mile was, invisibly, very poor. Local, real-time air quality monitoring would likely have saved his life.

With the closest outdoor air quality monitor located in Campbell River, about 75km away, Sayward is an ideal location to be supported by this initiative. Once installed, local residents will be able to access real-time air quality monitoring in Sayward through purpleair.com or IQair.com. This will allow the community to make more informed decisions about their lung health during wildfire smoke events and other times of poor air quality.

In addition, on September 16th, 2025, BC Lung will be in Gold River, where we will hold a Town Hall event at Gerry Morgan Memorial Centre and distribute indoor monitors, host a DIY air cleaner workshop, and share practical lung health tips. We'll also be installing an outdoor monitor in Gold River.

Media Statement—August 19th, 2025

The Village of Sayward has entered into a lease agreement with the Campbell River Search and Rescue Society (CRSAR) to lease a DJI Mavic 2 Enterprise Drone to CRSAR.

"The Village values and appreciates the dedicated volunteers of CRSAR who provide a vital lifeline to those who are lost or injured in the beautiful wilderness of northern Vancouver Island" said Sayward Mayor Mark Baker "For decades CRSAR has provided a crucial service to Sayward from helping stranded hikers to staffing checkpoints along the route of the Kusam Klimb, which is an annual endurance event in Sayward, where over 500 participants hike a 23 km course up and over Mount H'Kusam".



"This particular drone has a high-resolution camera that is capable of centimeter-level positioning accuracy and will provide incredible benefits to the CRSAR team" said CRSAR Drone Team Leader Jesse Katz-Totton "Drones can cover large areas in a short amount of time, and provide real-time visual data to CRSAR members. They can also access areas that may be difficult for rescue personnel to reach, due to factors such as terrain and weather conditions. Having a quickly deployable drone allows you to cover a lot more ground with less people. Using drones for these missions is relatively low in cost, as compared to a rescue team with several people, and especially as compared to using a helicopter to search from above".
