WATER TREATMENT PLANT UPDATE from VILLAGE OF SAYWARD

As of Monday morning, at 8:30 am (October 27th) the water level in the reservoir stood at 87%. While this is a huge improvement from the 60% reported on Sunday morning, the water level in the reservoir has decreased since this morning due to daytime usage as well as a system backwash in the Water Treatment Plant (WTP), both of which are expected. Fortunately, the WTP appears to be operating normally, and the plant is continuing to steadily produce and pump drinkable water back into Sayward's reservoir.

However, until the water level in the reservoir has been restored to its normal operating level (i.e., above 90%) we encourage Sayward residents to continue conserving our drinking water as much as possible.

Thank you for your cooperation while our Public Works staff continue their work at the Water Treatment Plant – as well as its water intake in Newcastle Creek – to help ensure the level in Sayward's water reservoir is restored to normal.
