Through the National Disaster Mitigation Program, the Strathcona Regional District (SRD) in collaboration with the Village of Sayward, has received funding to complete a Risk Assessment for the floodplains of the Salmon and White Rivers. At this session staff from the SRD and McElhanney Consultants Ltd. hope that you bring your stories, photos and videos of flooding, in particular any from the 1976 and 1990-1991 floods, as well your thoughts on future flood risk. One of our best ways to determine how flooding may affect a community is to learn from past events. Discussions with residents provide important information that would help better determine impacts of flooding and also provide insight into the resilience of the community. A risk assessment includes the identification of the potential hazards that are present within a defined geographical area, and an assessment of their likelihoods of occurrence, potential impacts to people, economy, structures, networks, and the natural environment.
